

### Local Mission

Thank you for your continued generosity with the Local Mission Fund! As always, funds go out as quickly as they come in and we are currently having to turn people away. Donations can be put in the offering plate with Local Mission Fund in the memo line or dropped off in the church office.

During the month of November, we were able to help **11** families or individuals with a total of \$630, used for food, household goods, rent or utilities. So far in December, we have helped **19** families or individuals with \$1,300.00 towards food, household goods, rent or utilities.

We keep a supply of soap, lotion, toothpaste, conditioner, toothbrushes, toilet paper, etc. on hand at the church to give to people who come in needing assistance. If you have extra at your home, bring them in! We'll give them away.

Dear Congregation:

I have received several questions regarding a mailing sent by North Country Food Bank, located in Crookston, MN. Many of you may recall receiving it in your own mail boxes over the years. It is not a mailing from your local Fergus Falls Community Food Shelf. To be clear, we are two separate entities.

While both organizations are worthy of your donations, the Fergus Falls Community Food Shelf operates solely on the generosity of the good people, businesses, organizations and churches in our area. Each year, our major fundraising drive is in March. At that time,

you will receive a donation request from us. North Country Food Bank's area of focus is Northwestern Minnesota.

The focal area of the Fergus Falls Community Food Shelf is right here in your community and within approximately a ten-mile radius of Fergus Falls. We reach out to help your neighbors, friends and family members. In fact, we serve about 1,000 people each month, 400 of those being children under the age of 18.
