The Pastor's Pen...



Joy to the world, the Lord has come! For those who observe it, Christmas is a day of much anticipation and celebration. In my home it is no different. Blessed with many friends and family, we have multiple celebrations to attend and gifts to exchange. It's a busy time with all the preparations and events at church. And there are so many traditions: decorating the house and tree, the kid's Christmas Pageant, the Service of Lessons & Carols, the communion and candlelight service, coffee cakes and sweet rolls on Christmas morning, and family worship. Christmas is a wondrous time, a joy-filled time.

We do all these things to celebrate the birth of Christ. But sometimes I wonder if the Christ child ends up buried under all the glitter, the trimmings, and the wrapping paper.

There are wars and rumors of wars, and areas about to erupt all over our world. There are droughts, floods, tornados, and mudslides. Many neighborhoods are shooting grounds and abuse is a daily occurrence. Justice cannot be forgotten as we celebrate Christmas. Christ came as a baby to rescue us but also to call us to follow him and be his disciples, to prepare the way for his second coming by building his kingdom even now as we await his return.

So, given all this, I need to ask:

What would Christmas be like without the wrappings?

What does Christmas look like for Christians living in refugee camps?

What does Christmas look like for children who do not receive gifts?

What does Christmas look like in parts of the world where gathering for worship makes congregants the target of extremists?

What is it about this Christ child that causes Christians, even those in the direct of situations, to celebrate and raise their voices to sing, "Joy to the world, the Lord has come"?

I'm not ready to give up all the traditions that help make the celebration of Christmas such a special time of year. But I need the reminder that Jeremy Summers offers: just as Advent is a "counter cultural act of intentional patience" so Christmas is an "upside down, backwards kingdom of Jesus, God comes to us" cosmic event. That's the message we all need to bring to our worship and our celebrations amid the distractions of Christmas.

The more distractions there are around us, the more intentional we need to be about taking the time to unwrap Christmas – to strip away all the shiny packaging and proclaim the gospel message: "Joy to the world, the Lord has come!"

Kids Club

Our Kids Club fall session came to a close on November 18th. We are all surprised at how quickly and how well our time together went! The kids loved running and playing during gym time, and most of us memorized a new Bible verse each week that corresponded to our story. Check out the poster hanging over the water fountain downstairs which shows the group of kids each week who could memorize (or almost memorize) the verse—they are called the Bible Memory Champions. It was a fabulous way to start off the Christian Education year, and it wouldn't have happened without all the dedicated volunteers and snack providers! It takes a community effort to run a successful children's ministry program, and we have a great team!

Sunday School and Nursery

Sunday school continues to clip along at a fast pace, much like Kids Club! The kids and teachers have been using a new curriculum this fall, and everyone seems to enjoy the new format. It is less cumbersome, more flexible, and filled with ideas for all ages. We will continue using this new curriculum in the winter and spring months.

We are currently beginning to work on the Christmas pageant, set for December 20th during the 10AM worship service (one service). Our music time will be used to learn Christmas carols, and we will read and/or run through the program during some of the lesson time. We still want teachers to be able to have some time with their classes, however, so we will be using Kids Club time to work on it as well.

The new class offered for parents and young children had its second successful month. Peek into the youth room on the first Sunday of the month and you are sure to find lots of activity—with little ones and parents enjoying time together! Help get the word out that we offer this valuable ministry!



During the fall season, the Christian Education committee has been discerning the needs of our church regarding the nursery. We have staffed the nursery with volunteers during the 11AM worship hour, we have explored possible staffing options and posted the position in various settings, we have prayed for clarity and guidance, and we have talked with the parents of younger children to determine their desires. The feedback was immensely helpful! It became clear that the majority of parents wish to have their children participate in worship as much as possible. It is a blessing that Federated welcomes and embraces very young children at worship! At this time, we have determined to create a comfortable space in the narthex for parents and children; this way, if a child needs to move around, both parent and child can still feel a part of the worshipping community. We are also going to begin exploring the possibility of streaming the worship service on a monitor in the nursery or another space for nursing moms or others who might wish to move to a different space with their children. Those of us whose children are older can easily remember the anxiety of having a child who makes noise during church, and yet, when we pass through that stage, don't most of us realize that those sounds are WONDERFUL to hear as we worship? It is a reminder of the great blessing of children and the importance of sharing the gospel with all ages and stages! And don't worry about the preacher, he only ever heard his OWN children during worship—just like the rest of us!! We will continue to staff the nursery with volunteers during the 11AM worship service; the nursery will be unlocked for parents and their children during the 9AM service, as well.

Our confirmands are in their second month of classes. We gather after school on Wednesdays for snack and games followed by an animated hour of learning! You all would be so impressed with the inquisitive minds and thoughtful individuals we have in our middle school group here! I think I can speak for all the teachers and say that there is more discipleship-building and faith development going on during this time than one can even imagine. Pray for these wonderful young people who are being given the opportunity to grow their faith and become adult members of our church family!

Parish Nursing Notes - Connie Seltz, Parish Nurse Coordinator

Sometimes it is difficult for me to decide what to write about in this newsletter, but today I think I must write about Advance Healthcare Planning. I was reminded about its importance by a Lake Region Healthcare "Community Health Conversation" held last month at M-State. Without a directive, the medical community chooses to err on the side of full treatment, including aggressive care which may result in prolonged and expensive care.

Advance Care Planning is the process a person uses to prepare the Health Care Directive document. In order for the document to be useful it must clearly express the wishes (be educated); be accurate (define words); be complete (signed, witnessed); and be communicated to all who need to know

(advocate, family, healthcare providers). A trained facilitator may be helpful to work through the process. There are about 25 persons, mostly social workers in the area who have been trained. The Federated Church paid for the training for Pastor Doug and me.

Lake Region Healthcare provides an excellent "Health Care Directives" form for your use. I have found it helpful and much easier to complete than the "Five Wishes" form of a few years ago.

If you have done due diligence and already completed a directive, consider reviewing it to be certain it reflects current life/health conditions. The recommendation is that directives should be updated if any of the following changes occur: 1. A decade has passed; 2. A death of an advocate or a loved one; 3. A Divorce occurs; 4. A diagnosis of a serious health condition; and, 5. When you experience a significant decline or deterioration of an existing health condition, especially when you are unable to live on your own.

As you gather over the holidays with family, perhaps the conversation can begin. Make it fun. Bake some cookies. Here's a highly recommended book: The Conversation: A Revolutionary Plan for End-of-Life Care by Dr. Angelo Volandes.




The theme for our after-school Wednesday program this fall has been: Bible Blunders--Mistakes people made in the Bible and how God fixed them. Some of the people we talked about are: Adam and Eve, Cain and Abel, Elijah, Paul, and the Disciples. The kids hear the weekly story, sing songs related to the story, and memorize a Bible verse. We then have crafts and games, and supper for the kids and parents.

Triennium

One of the opportunities I've been given this year is to be on our Presbytery's Triennium planning "GO" team. Triennium is a gathering of approximately 6000 youth from around the country. It is held every three years in West Layfeyette, Indiana at the Purdue University campus. The next Triennium will be July 19-23, 2016. Some of my responsibilities as part of the "GO" Team are helping to plan the trip, reaching out to youth from around the area, and serving on the work crew at Triennium throughout the week.

Worship

Each Sunday I participate in worship as one of the guitarists and song leaders in praise band for our contemporary service. During the traditional and contemporary services, I sometimes read scripture or provide liturgical reading, and I have had the opportunity to sing solos and do special music several times this fall.
