Mission Dinner—November 9th

The Mission Dinner, held on Sunday, November 9, 2014 was a great success with nearly one hundred people in attendance. Doug and Nancy Hansen shared about their visit to the House of Hope in Zacapa, Guatemala, presented the mission of the orphanage, and offered ways to support this important ministry.

Our congregation is raising funds to pay the school fees for each child (\$330 per child for one year). At the Mission Dinner we raised \$2,923 – enough to send nine kids to school. Adding this to the \$3,278 already raised this year, we have collected \$6,201 (or 18.7 school fees) – only \$69 to go!

Thank you to all the cooks, dishwashers, servers, diners, and donors who helped to make this Mission Dinner our best ever.

The Pastor's Pen...



In Walking on Water, Madeleine L'Engle comments that "the Christian holiday which is easiest for us is Christmas, because it touches on what is familiar; and the story...is one we have always known." That, however, may be both bane and blessing, and it may explain why we let the folklore, customs, and frantic pace of this holy season obscure its essential truth for us. Over-familiarity can dull the meaning and diminish our response to any experience or relationship in life. Is that why many persons approach Christmas with either wistful yearning or cynical disdain, hoping each year to see, as W. H. Auden put it, "the actual Vision" of Christmas, or having missed it so often no longer believing the "Vision" exists?

Because we need to see this vision and to appropriate for faith the truth that Christmas celebrates, the church long ago set aside a margin of time celebrating the event of Jesus' birth so that believers could center attention more closely upon its deepest meaning, be nurtured by it, and respond to it. They called it the season of Advent (a Latin word meaning "come to"), underscoring how in this event God came to the world, entered human history, and is still revealing the love that makes us whole and opens us to eternal life.

We need a season of Advent to interrupt and unsettle us, to give us pause, to make us ponder, and to challenge our intentions and priorities. We need this season because we can be creatures of habit and routine who take each other and our spiritual life for granted. We need this season because we are prone to reduce the mysterious in order to make it manageable and marketable. We need this season as a reminder that our encounter with God through Christ can forever change our life and our world.

Indeed, Advent is not so much what we do (no matter how devoted or disciplined we are) but what God does for us in Jesus Christ. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth; we have beheld his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father...And from his fullness have we all received, grace upon grace (John 1:14, 16).

So let us attend upon this mystery and celebrate how God comes into our world – in Jesus Christ with the whole-making power of love.

May the joys and mysteries of Advent surprise you once again! Wishing you a Merry Christmas and a Joyous New Year. Pastor Doug


