The Pastor's Pen...



It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh, I live by faith in the Son of God who loved me and gave himself for me. (Galatians 2:20)

In ancient Rome there lived a man named Valentine. He was a kind-hearted physician who practiced medicine out of a small room in his home. One might even describe him as "a gastronomical physician" because of his purported love of food and cookery. "Dr." Valentine always made a special effort to offer his patients medicines that tasted delicious. He would take care to mix bitter tasting medicines with wine, milk or honey to make them more palatable for the sick and injured. He cleansed wounds with wine vinegar and would use freshly ground herbs and roots to relieve pain.

Faith was also a significant part of Valentine's life, and although Christianity was not popular at that time (many were persecuted for their faith in Jesus) Valentine became a Christian priest and would lead others in prayer. Often he would pray for the health of his patients.

One day a jailer for the Emperor knocked on Valentine's door clutching his blind daughter in his arms. He had learned of Valentine's medical and spiritual healing abilities and he appealed to Valentine to treat his daughter's blindness. Valentine knew that the girl's condition would be difficult to treat, but he gave the man his word he would do his best. Valentine examined the little girl, gave her ointment for her eyes, and scheduled a series of subsequent visits. Several weeks passed and the girl's sight was not restored; yet the jailer and his daughter never wavered in their faith and returned each week for their visits with Valentine.

Then one day, Valentine received a visit from Roman soldiers who arrested him, destroyed his medicines, and admonished him for his religious views. When the little girl's father learned of Valentine's arrest, he wanted to intervene, but there was nothing he could do. Valentine understood. Knowing that his execution was imminent, Valentine asked the jailer for paper, pen and ink. He quickly jotted a farewell note and handed it to the jailer to give to his daughter. Valentine was executed later that day – February 14, 270 AD – by order of the Emperor Claudius II Gothicus.

When the jailer went home, his daughter greeted him at the door. She opened the note from Valentine and discovered a yellow crocus inside. The message said, "From your Valentine." As the little girl looked down upon the crocus she saw brilliant colors for the first time in her life! The girl's eyesight was restored.

In 496, Pope Gelasius I named February 14th as Saint Valentine's Day. In modern times, we show our love and affection on Valentine's Day by sending cards, flowers and special messages to our sweethearts. Crocuses, the flower of St. Valentine, herald the arrival of spring by gracing our gardens and homes with their beautiful color.

This is one of the many legends surrounding the life and death of Valentine. Undoubtedly there is some truth to parts of this story; just as surely, other parts have been embellished through time and telling. But at the heart of the story is love – the love of Valentine for his patients, the love of a father and daughter, the love of God for us made manifest in the person of Jesus Christ who inspired Valentine to great acts of charity.


Like St. Valentine, we show our love for God and all God has done for us through Christ Jesus, by living out our faith. When we show kindness to others, we recognize God's kindness to us. When we help one another, we celebrate God's help when we were unable to help ourselves. When we love one another, we emulate God's love for us in Jesus.

You are God's Valentine, for God loves you better than anyone else can. Enjoy this Valentine's Day secure in the knowledge that you are a beloved child of God.


Youth - Doug Snaza




