

The Pastor's Pen...



Just imagine that this Lent is going to be different from every other Lent we've experienced. Imagine that there will be many graces offered us this year. Let's even imagine that God is going to help transform our lives with greater freedom, greater joy, and deeper desires for love and service.

Preparing our hearts is a process of preparing our desires. This means practicing our sense of anticipation. If we imagine Lent as an "ordeal" or a time to dread in some way, then we've already pre-disposed ourselves to not get very much out of it. These days before Lent are a time to start anticipating something wonderful that is about to happen.

Our sense of excitement and anticipation will grow more easily if we begin to imagine what God wants to give us. There is something coming that we can truly look forward to. If we get too focused on ourselves and what we are going to do or not do, we could risk missing the gift God wants to give us. We have to keep aware of the fact that grace comes from God. This is about God's great desire to bless us. With this mindset, it is easier for us to imagine that what we really want to do is place ourselves in a space to receive what God wants to give us.

We receive God's gifts as body-persons: we experience things with our senses, relish them with our imaginations, and share in God's own creative and loving activity when our hearts and hands work together for and with others.

We can let our homes be places full of the holy – things that help raise our minds and hearts to God. Our world is full of so many images that lure our minds and hearts elsewhere. Some symbols will carry the ongoing meaning we give them, for us and for our families and loved ones.

We can make sure that we have a cross in a central place in our home during Lent. A bowl of water on our dining room table can be transformed into a reminder of our preparing to renew our baptismal promises. A candle can be lit at each meal to remind us of the light of Christ among us in Lent and to prepare us for the new fire being lit at Easter. Placing a Bible in a central place in our home reminds us of the central place of God's Word in our lives on this Lenten journey.

This year's Lent can be different. It will take an openness to God's grace, a deep desire to receive what is being offered us, and a few signs and symbols to help us stay focused throughout the season. But if we do these things, God's desire for our hearts and our desire for greater union with God will meet. Lent will no longer feel like a burden, but rather a blessing.



Fergus Falls Community Food Shelf Annual Report

Each household gets an average between 65-100 pounds of food, depending on their family size. It is meant to be a 3-day emergency supply of food, but because of generous donations from organizations, businesses and individuals, what they receive lasts them twice that long.

In 2014, we saw an average number of 355 families per month came to the Food Shelf. We have seen that number increase steadily each year.

In 2014, we had 858 NEW people come to the Food Shelf seeking help. In January 2015, we saw 1,118 people, 116 of them NEW to us! We hear many stories of hardship and heartache. There are many people who are disabled, don't have money for groceries after paying for a new tire, their furnace broke down or their hours were cut at work.

There is no paid staff at the Food Shelf; we are 100% volunteer based! In 2014, our volunteers logged 4,658 hours working at the Food Shelf. The main supply of volunteers is from the area churches. We have several other groups that come from organizations, businesses and two groups that come in to satisfy a classroom requirement.

Our biggest push for donations is normally in March, but with the increasing needs of area families, it's imperative that we see donations continue throughout the year.

We are incredibly blessed with food donations, but would like to share that with every dollar of cash donated, we are able to purchase 5 TIMES the amount of food than if you or I were to walk into the local grocery store. We purchase from North Country Food Bank in Crookston, as well as locally.

Thank you to our congregation for your tremendous support through volunteers and donations! I would like to give a HUGE thank you to those from our congregation that volunteer during the year: Jan & Gary Nelson, Kathy & Del Zimmerman, Randy Wasvick, Wayne Link, The Federated Youth Group, Ingrid Morgan, and Char Zielin. Again, thank you all!

Parish Nursing Notes - Connie Seltz, Parish Nurse Coordinator

My dentist, Dr. Mark Murphy, told me during my recent oral exam that "dry mouth" resulting from medication side effects can cause cavities in as little as 6 months. Prescription drugs come with extensive literature that most of us read with interest so that we are alert to the unwanted effects. However, over-the-counter (OTC) purchases sometimes are not used with as much care and concern. For example, antihistamines used regularly should be a concern. Dr. Murphy's advice comes in a hand-out "Xylitol Directions" posted on the Parish Nursing bulletin board. Warning: Xylitol is toxic to dogs! Here's a summary of that posting:

Strive for Five

Chew 5 pieces of gum 5 times a day for five minutes Use immediately after meals to reduce acid in the mouth Chew no more than 5 minutes or until flavor is gone.

Benefits of Xylitol

Will increase production of saliva by 10X Reduces cavities from 60-80% Reduces bacterial plaque by 50% Is safe for diabetics Reduces acid in the mouth

Ice Breaker-Ice Cubes –Sugar Free gum Spry Xylitol Gum Glee Gum Sugar Free 100% Xylitol ACT Dry Mouth Lozenge Other products can be found online

Welcome to New Member, Jolene Beck!

Jolene Beck writes: I was born in Jud, ND, on Nov. 27th, 1941. I had two brothers: Dennis, who was older and who passed away three years ago, and my younger brother Harvey – yes, I'm that middle child!

My Mom & Dad were farmers out around Edgeley, ND. In the year 1945, one hot summer night, there was a fire and eleven buildings burned on the farm. They lost livestock, machinery shed, all of the buildings. Several days later, they found several empty gas cans out in the field. That's when we moved to Fergus Falls and they bought a small farm out at Broken Down Dam, which is where we stayed.

We retired in 1976 and came back to Fergus Falls. The reason I say we is because I worked awful hard for his money.

I worked at the Regional Treatment Center for 29 years and retired in 2004. My husband passed away in 2010 – he was the love of my life. We had a wonderful life together and so many great memories. Life has been good to me.
