The Pastor's Pen...



"I will pray until my heart rejoices in you."

Those words, from a prayer by Pastor Tim Keller, have been much on my mind and in my heart lately. For nearly a month, those words have filled my thoughts. Why? Because prayer has been difficult for me lately. With so many people in our congregation sick or in crisis, I wonder if my prayers are being heard. With the demands of work and school and family pressing in, I wonder when my prayers will be answered? But then I realized, I've got it all wrong.

Listen to Keller's words again:

"I will pray until my heart rejoices in **YOU**." It's not about me and my problems and my prayers at all. It's about being faithful to the One to whom I pray. God is worthy of my prayers and my praise, no matter what my state of mind or heart.

"I will pray until my heart **REJOICES** in you." Even when prayer is difficult, when times are tough, we can always find a way to rejoice in the One who is greater than our problems, our fears, and our doubts.

"I will pray **UNTIL** my heart rejoices in you." There are seasons in our life, and in our life of prayer. Some days prayer is easy. Some days prayer is reduced to a single word: "Help!" But we keep on praying. And praying. And praying. Until our heart finds a way to rejoice in God again.

"I **WILL** pray until my heart rejoices in you." This is our commitment to keep on praying to and listening for God's word to us. Through the good times and the bad times, we will pray.

The bottom line is this: prayer changes us. When we pray, we do not coerce God or change God's mind, but we do move our heart and minds and lives into line with God's thinking.

Learning to pray no matter what and to find joy in the midst of sorrow have been good lessons for me this Lenten season. So, let's keep on praying: me for you and you for me. And let's rejoice in God who is ever faithful.

Christian Education

35 Syouth

Did you know that Syria was once one of the strongholds of early Christianity? The Apostle Paul was journeying toward Damascus in Syria when he met the risen Lord! He then began evangelizing throughout the Middle East—and especially in Syria! Well, today, there are few, if any, believers in this once-Christian area of the world. The Christian Education and Youth committee, along with the Junior and Senior High youth, are working on a special Lenten dinner to be held on March 2nd as a way of drawing attention to the plight of Christians in the Middle East. We will be devoting the Wednesday worship service to persecuted Christians and refugees, serving a Syrian dinner, and using the money raised to purchase World Vision backpacks for refugee children. These backpacks, which contain various daily necessities, each cost \$22. We are encouraging families or individuals to consider sponsoring at least one backpack. Everyone who purchases or packs one will be given the opportunity to write a personal note to the recipient. We hope all of you will make plans to come to this Lenten dinner, for education, fellowship, and service! If you have any questions, don't hesitate to ask me!

On another note, check out the narthex area when you get a chance! It is a work in progress, sponsored by the Christian Education committee and envisioned by the talented Linda MacFarlane! The hope is to create a multi-use room for families, committees, Christian Ed classes, Bible studies, youth (for studying!) and just a comfortable space to hang out. The room itself is beautiful, with so much natural light and good views of the world outside; we would love for it to get more use by the whole church! We are already thrilled with the way it is taking shape!

Senior High Youth Group

The youth groups—junior and senior high—will be helping with the March 2nd Lenten service and dinner. It has become a tradition for our youth to provide one of the dinners during Lent, and the proceeds raised during that dinner have typically gone to mission trips. This year, on the heels of two big trips (Guatemala and Colorado), the money, instead, will go to refugee children in the Middle East and Europe. Once we see how many backpacks we can order for assembly, we will set a date for youth of all ages (and anyone else in the church family who would like!) to put the backpacks together.

Our next session, called "Where in the World is Jesus?", begins on March 2nd and will run through April 13th. The group will follow the path that Jesus took from the triumphant entry into Jerusalem on what we call Palm Sunday all the way to His ascension into heaven at the end of His earthly ministry. I am excited to continue working with our kids and the wonderful team of volunteers that help make this ministry possible. Pastor Doug is will be a part of the team during this coming session!

Sunday School

Our teachers and kids continue to meet each week for learning and music—we hope you have walked by to hear the singing during the first 15 minutes of class! Each class is working through the second lesson book in our new series, "All-in-One Sunday School". Additional family friendly furniture is being purchased for the narthex. With the addition of new furniture and a bathroom, a variety of activities can be accommodated in this beautiful space. Karen Dent, Director of Christian Education and the Christian Education Committee have an exciting vision for how this space can be transformed into a space that will meet many needs. This is a wonderful example of how we can work together as partners

We need volunteers to do much of the work in the new bathroom. We will contract plumbing through Pat Collins, but need help with building interior walls, sheet rocking, insulating and many other tasks to get the job done. Finally, we are well underway with a new Endowment Plan. We have already had members of our church express an interest in giving to establish funds that will benefit our church ministry for years to come. 

We anticipate this to be about a six-month process with ample opportunity to shape the final vision for our future. Thank you in advance for helping to discern and define that for Federated Church.
