Christ Is Risen! He Is Risen indeed!

The celebration of Easter is absolutely central to the life of the church and to faithful Christians. Why? Without the new life of Christ touching every aspect of who we are and what we do, we are simply going through religious motions, playing religious games, and putting a religious veneer over lives that are just like anyone else's.

To live lives touched by the Resurrection means many things, but I'd like you to think about these two:

- It means that we **live unafraid of death and all that it brings with it**. Many live in such a way that they will do ANYTHING to avoid pain, aging, illness and death. They go to extraordinary lengths to deny the inevitability of it, fooling only themselves and a few select others who are in on the game. We use drugs to lessen the impact of what's coming, or we make life choices that are destructive, or we try to fool ourselves into acting or looking (sort of) much younger than we are, or we are simply paralyzed by fear into a kind of stupor that keeps us from doing or being anything.

- It also means that we **live free from sin's power**. Has someone done something to you that still controls your heart and mind? Have you done something that has clouded or affected your whole life? Have you taken a road of temptation that leads only to damage to you and others? Have you allowed prejudice or fear to warp your heart so that you cannot love and forgive?

Easter is so much more than eggs, bunnies, jelly beans, chocolate bunnies, and dressing up. It's about the **new life we have in Christ**, in which we are set free to love, forgive and serve, and thereby find a sense of peace and joy in all that we do. By grabbing hold of the cross, we share in Jesus' victory over sin, death and all that would destroy us.

Please join us as we prepare for and celebrate Easter. **Palm Sunday** is April 9th (10 AM), and during Holy Week we offer a **Maundy Thursday** service with communion (April 13th at 7PM), and a **Good Friday** service (April 14th at 7 PM). On **Easter Sunday** (April 16th) we will sing God's praises and rejoice in Christ's resurrection at 10 AM.

Local Mission

Thank you for your continued generosity with the Local Mission Fund! Those who are helped by this fund are extremely grateful for the extra support they receive during tough times. According to our policy, we are able to help each family or individual three times during a 12 month period, with up to \$100 a time, depending on funds. We assist with food, utilities, rent, and, in emergency situations, a night at a hotel. We were able to help many families and individuals during December and January, and the fund is once again empty. Donations can be put in the offering plate with Local Mission Fund in the memo line or dropped off in the church office. Thank you!!

During the month of February, we were able to help **10** families or individuals with a total of **\$526.36**, used for food, household goods, rent or utilities. As of March 24, we have helped **5** families or individuals with **\$295.25** towards food, household goods, rent or utilities.

We keep a supply of soap, lotion, toothpaste, conditioner, toothbrushes, toilet paper, etc. on hand at the church to give to people who come in needing assistance. If you have extra at your home, bring them in! We'll give them away.

Doctoral Studies

I just finished my fourth course (March 31, 2017). This course, entitled "Missional Leadership," focused on the role of the pastor within a missional congregation. "Missional" is the term used to describe a congregation that is actively seeking the Spirit's call to follow God out into the community and to partner with what God is already doing in our neighborhoods. This term paper included the results of the Survey of Worship Preferences. Thank you to the 152 respondents! I am grateful for your input. I will publish my findings once the worship task force is able to review the results.

The completion of this course marks the halfway point in my doctoral studies. For the next eighteen months, my work will be focused on my final thesis – with its yet-to-be-determined theme – which is due in February 2019. If all goes according to plan, graduation will be in May 2019. Your continued prayers are appreciated: specifically, pray for the Spirit to help me identify my thesis topic (due July 2017!).

One of my tasks was to lead our church through the Discovering Our Future Process. It has been several months since we completed the first phase of that process. I am reporting on what has been accomplished so far.

As you will remember, from the input of the congregation, four priorities were approved by the Deacons and Elders and the congregation. Four teams were established to follow up on the input from our congregation. I am excited about what these teams have accomplished in a very short time. Here is a report from each team:

- Community Engagement Team. This team has been responsible for the development of the vision statement that is guiding all aspects of our church's life Open Hearts. Open Minds. Open Arms. You might have noticed that this statement is on all our written pieces, our website and Facebook. The team has also worked hard to get our church out into the community. Now, they are developing written material to help committees and boards advertise their events in and outside the church. I am excited about their creativity and commitment.
- Inspiring and Dynamic Worship Team. This team has met several times and is analyzing and interpreting the results of the recent worship survey. From this survey and original input from the congregation, they will

be looking at ways to affirm the many things that are working and recommend ways to make our worship more dynamic and inspiring.

- Mutigenerational Fellowship Team. This Team has already organized events that have brought together people of all ages. From all accounts the events have been well attended and appreciated.
- Campus Enhancement Team. The team has met many times to consider if and how our facility can be enhanced to better serve our church and community. We have developed a working relationship with Comstock Construction to review our facility and make recommendations. Most importantly, we have received good and usable input from the recent Campus Enhancement Survey. If you have not returned yours, please send it via email or return to the church office. All teams will continue to work on the priorities developed during the Discovering Our Future. We are moving forward to put into actions what we have discovered about God's will for our life together. 
Another Mission to Guatemala

At about the same time that Mike and Michelle Loomer were praying about the mission to House of Hope in Guatemala, my husband Bill and I were also thinking that the Lord was calling us to make a mission trip. Unfortunately, we were not in communication with Mike or Michele, but Bill was involved with our Presbytery in Willmar. He heard that there were people that had a partnership arrangement with a presbytery in Guatemala. They had an ongoing relationship for almost 20 years at that time and were getting ready for another trip. They would be installing a water treatment system in one of the villages. This would be the 5th treatment system installed and the last one our Presbytery would be involved with. We learned that there is no safe water in Guatemala unless it is treated. The systems we installed would provide safe water for everyone in the village and a source of income for the people. It also included an educational segment that taught people why clean water was important and how to wash their hands to prevent illness. Bill and I talked about it, prayed about it and decided we would apply to be on the team. It was a life-changing and an eye-opening experience. We saw how the relationship between the people of MN and the Occidente Presbytery changed their (and our) lives, especially those of the women. I had the opportunity to go on another trip to Guatemala this year, and see the continued partnership. When partnership first began, women were second class citizens and had very little value. Now, women are leaders in the churches, two have been ordained (the first in Guatemala), and now there are several in seminary. Other projects that we from MN have been involved with are: 1) Supporting ministers (who have very little education) with seminars on Reformed Theology; 2) assisting to build homes that are not substandard (four were built), 3) sending scholarships to ministers'

children so that they can afford to attend school. There is no free education in Guatemala. 4) This year, we did classes for the women in three villages about health issues that affect women. Topics they asked for included diabetes, menopause, foot care, illness in the home and the Zika virus. The women had also asked to learn how to quilt. When I was telling some of the ladies from Federated about this, they said "take some of our supplies, we have so much." I ended up taking four small boxes of cut up quilt squares, cutters, scissors, and pins that translated into 55 pounds in the suitcase! Two others had also brought a similar amount and it was a good thing because instead of three villages, there were women representing 21 villages!! We had enough to send packages of supplies home with each village! Talk about loaves and fishes!!

The last project that I want to tell you about is one that you will be hearing more about in the coming weeks and months. It is a prayer partnership. About 14 of our churches in the Presbytery of Minnesota Valleys have been partnered with 14 churches in the Presbytery of Occidente. Each church partner is committed to pray for their partner in the other country. Pastor Doug brought this opportunity to our session and they have unanimously approved it. What will happen is that each month our session will choose five prayer requests, we will translate it into Spanish and send it to our partner church and they will send us five prayer requests from their session each month also. We have been partnered with the Belen Church in Quetzaltenango or Xela (pronounced Shala). It is the largest church in the Occidente Presbytery with about 1000 members. I met their pastor Jairo Marti. He is on the provincial Board and is looking forward to hearing from us. What an opportunity for each of us to be involved in the missions in Guatemala even though we cannot all physically go there.



Mission Initiative for 2017

The Mission Committee is designating Habitat for Humanity as our Mission Initiative for 2017. The Federated Church is the first congregation in Fergus Falls to become a Covenant Partner with Habitat, which means we will support Habitat ministry with volunteers and funds. We appreciate Habitat's new plan to renovate homes in Fergus Falls, raising the standard of living for more of our residents, rather than always building new homes. Stay tuned for more information and opportunities about how you can get involved...
