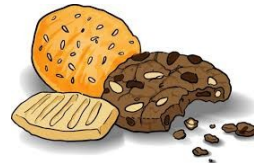

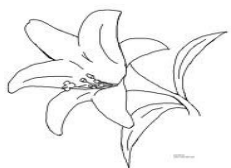

## The Pastor's Pen...



Sir John Bowring, at one time governor of Hong Kong, was a very gifted naturalist, statesman, political economist and linguist who could write in thirteen different languages and dialects.

One day when he was in the Orient, he was looking over an area devastated by an earthquake. Standing high above the ruins, like a lone sentinel, stood the tower of a church. And piercing the sky with its silhouette, on the very tip of the tower was a cross. The sight of this so moved Sir John Bowring that he penned the words of that great old hymn:

In the Cross of Christ I glory,  
Towering o'er the wrecks of time;  
All the light of sacred story  
Gathers round its head sublime.

And out of the midst of the turmoil, violence and suffering of today's world stands the Cross of Jesus Christ, of which there is no greater symbol of both love and hate ... death and life ... judgment and forgiveness...despair and hope.

Most crosses are a symbol only of death. But the Cross of Christ is much more than this. While it is a symbol of Christ's death on the cross, more than ever it is a symbol of life—eternal life.

Every time we see a cross, whether it be by the roadside or on a tombstone, we are reminded of the certainty of death—an appointment we all will keep. As God's Word says, "No one has power over the day of his death" (Ecclesiastes 8:8). And, "It is appointed for men to die once and after this comes judgment" (Hebrews 9:27).

But every time we see a cross that represents the Cross of Christ we are reminded of the fact that over two thousand years ago the Son of God came to earth to die in our place that we might receive the gift of eternal life. He came to identify himself with all mankind, only to be rejected, condemned and crucified on the Cross at Calvary. He came to die, not for himself, but for us in our place, to pay the just penalty for all our sins that we might be cleansed, forgiven, made whole and fit for Heaven.

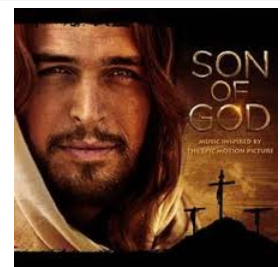
God's Word explains it this way: "Therefore, just as through one man sin entered into the world, and death through sin, and so death spread to all men, because all sinned" (Romans 5:12). And again, "For since death came through a man, the resurrection of the dead comes also through a man. For as in Adam all die, so in Christ all will be made alive" (1 Cor. 15:21-22).

No matter how hard we try, we simply cannot save ourselves—neither through good works, intellectual achievement nor man-made religions. Had we been able to save ourselves, Jesus Christ never would have had to die for us. And as "Jesus answered, 'I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me'" (John 14:6). Now through Jesus Christ we can receive the gift of eternal life by placing our faith and trust in him.

Jesus Christ is God's only provision for humanity's sin. Only through him can we find true hope for this life and the life to come. This hope of eternal life is ours today because God saw fit to save us through Christ's death and resurrection.

Rejoice! New and eternal life is yours! Happy Easter.

#### **2014 Mission Initiative**

The Mission Initiative for 2014 is House of Hope in Zacapa, Guatemala. The House of Hope (Casa de Esperanza) is home to 26 children and youth. The aim of the House of Hope is to raise these children of God in a safe, loving, Christian environment, to educate them, and then send them out prepared for higher education or employment.

Funding for the House of Hope comes entirely from private donations. The need is great, the wish list is long. The Mission Committee has chosen to focus on school fees as our Mission Initiative for 2014. The House of Hope provides quality, Christian education through a combination of printed and online resources. The annual school fee for one student is \$330. Together, we can raise enough to cover the annual school fees for all 19 students – a total of about \$6300. We will be collecting donations all year long, and will post updated totals in the monthly newsletter.

**The Federated Church will be delivering Meals By Wheels March 24<sup>th</sup> through April 4<sup>th</sup>.** There are now five routes a day, serving approximately 60 people. Contact Jo Schmidt (739-9497) if you would like to help.

### Parish Nursing Notes – *Connie Seltz, Parish Nurse Coordinator*

From "The Disciplines of Lent" Sunday Morning Bible Study: Gratitude is the first discipline. So, let me begin by thanking Bonnie Gondrez, Parish Nurse Volunteer for faithfully providing blood pressure screening opportunities every first Sunday. A normal blood pressure is *below* 120/80. Readings from 120/80 through 139/89 are pre-hypertensive.

The American Heart Association provides the "Ten Commandments for a Healthy Lifestyle":

1. Know your blood pressure and have it checked regularly.
2. Know what your weight should be and keep it at that level.
3. Avoid fast foods.
4. Don't smoke or use tobacco products.
5. Take your medications as prescribed.
6. Keep your doctor appointments.
7. Follow doctor's advice about exercise.
8. Avoid smoke filled environments.
9. Know your LDL and HDL cholesterol levels.
10. Eat five servings of fruits and vegetables daily.

### **Jacob and Karoline Gustafson**

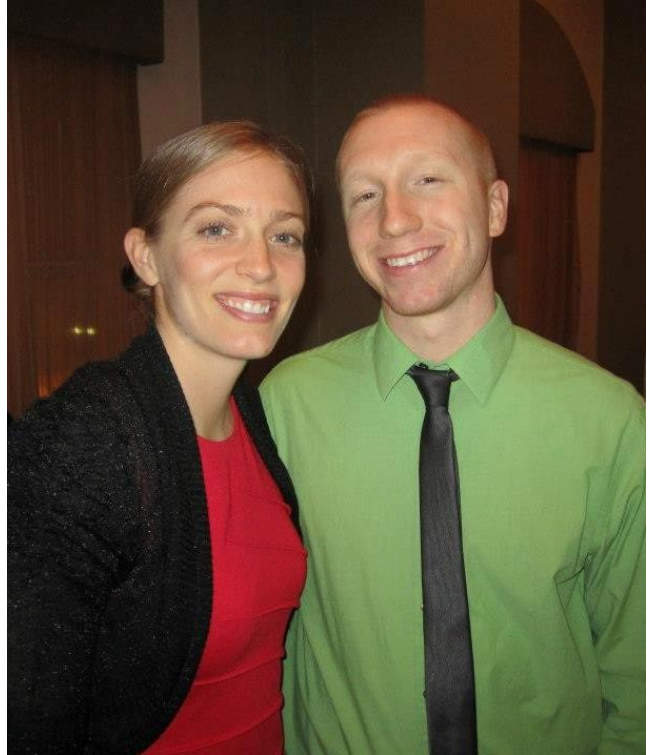
