

# The Pastor's Pen...



During a visit to Croatia 20 years ago, Pope John Paul II proclaimed, "Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people, and Alleluia is our song." Are we really the Easter people? I think we should be. This is still the Easter season and it continues until Pentecost Sunday, May 15, 2016.

What does it mean to be "Easter people"? Being an Easter person has much to do with how we view our faith and how we live it out. Jesus is so alive for us on Easter Sunday morning; he needs to be alive for us and in us every day, and certainly in these days which follow Easter so closely. At the time of His Resurrection, Jesus' followers did not whisper "He is risen," they shouted it and rejoiced! That is how we need to approach our faith as well.

During Lent leading up to Easter, we did not use the word "Alleluia" in our songs and liturgies. We put it away until Easter. Each year I'm surprised by how much I miss that word. It's so joyous to hear "Alleluia!" again when we shout it out on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday! We are not just an Easter people, we are also an Alleluia people. We are called to exemplify Alleluia in everything we do.

Who is an Alleluia person? Certainly people who seem to just brim over with the Good News, who constantly reflect the joy of being a Christian. It is also possible to be an Alleluia person in quiet ways, but others do need to see that God is alive in us in everything we do. Easter is so much more than just one day: that first Easter Sunday was just the beginning of Easter-life for God's Easter-people.

For many years, the Sundays which followed Easter during the Easter season were called the first, second or third "Sunday after Easter." When the Church adopted the new liturgical calendar that changed to the "Sunday of Easter." Thus, we are not winding down from Easter, we are in the midst of it. We became Easter people at our Baptisms. We should be Easter people every day and every week and during every season. Being an Easter person means acknowledging our call to discipleship and stewardship. We should begin and end everything with Alleluia. Alleluia (or Hallelujah) means "Praise to God," which is not just something we sing, chant, or say: it is something we live. By living our lives in praise of God we can truly be an Easter people.

# **Christian Education**

Following the March 2<sup>nd</sup> Lenten service which featured the plight of Christians around the world, I had several inquiries about books and sources of information. It is a very emotional and difficult topic to research, and we often cannot understand the profound danger that our faith incites around the world. As Western Christians who have access to on-line information, a free media, and numerous books and magazine articles on the subject of persecution, I believe we hold a special burden to learn about and educate others as to the great risks and stories of our brothers and sisters in Christ. Some books which I have read and authors I would recommend include: *Dreams and Visions* and *Killing Christians* by Tom Doyle; *I Am N* by the Voice of the Martyrs; *Persecuted: The Global Assault on Christians* by Paul Marshall and Lela Gilbert; *In the Lion's Den* by Nina Shea and Ravi Zacharias; *Never Submit* by Lt. Col. Robert Maginnis; *Christian Heroes* by Dave and Neta Jackson; *Jesus Freaks* by DC Talk; *Epicenter* by Joel Rosenberg.

Two organizations which report on persecuted Christians are the Voice of the Martyrs and Open Doors USA. I encourage all of us to learn more about what is happening to the faithful around the world. Here are some of the statistics I provided at the Lenten service:

- More Christians were martyred in the 20<sup>th</sup> century than in all other centuries combined [Christianity.com]
- It is claimed that 105,000 Christians are martyred for their faith each year [Deseret News, 2011]
- Currently, over 100 million Christians are being persecuted worldwide [Reuters, 2013]
- 70 percent of the world's population lives in a religiously intolerant environment [Pew Forum, 2011]
- North Korea: in 2014, it continues to be the worst country in the world for persecution
- Nigeria: In 2010, Christians suffered terror from Muslim extremists. Whole villages were massacred
- Iran: Its parliament believes Muslims who change their faith should be put to death
- India: Up to 70,000 in Orissa have been forced to flee their homes in riots against Christians
- Indonesia: Between the years of 2000-2002, Muslims slaughtered 10,000 Christians
- Iraq: half of Iraq's Christians have fled the country since the fall of Saddam Hussein
- Egypt: Under Islamist pressure, Coptic Christians are being forced from their homes
- Syria: By 2012, most of the 80,000 Christians in Homs had been 'cleansed' from their homes
- Europe: persecution is coming in by stealth through EU equality directives

# THINGS TO KNOW FROM THE DCO—Rev. Dr. C. Edward Morgan, DCO

One of my favorite verses is Philippians 1:3-5, "I thank my God every time I remember you, constantly praying with joy in every one of my prayers for all of you, because of your sharing (partnership) in the gospel from the first day until now."

I use this verse from Philippians again because I think it accurately relates what is going on in our church. I see a lot of people using their gifts and abilities to do Christ's work. There is also a lot of joy expressed as we work together. Last month, I reported on an exciting new project to convert the kitchenette off the narthex to a bathroom. That project is complete. Many people worked, but I especially want to thank Randy Wasvick, Skip Zielin, John MacFarlane, Linda MacFarlane, and Pete Konrad for many hours of their time and their talents. Please stop by and see the whole narthex and say thanks to those who worked on it.

On March 8, we completed a ministry assessment as part of the visioning process we have begun. The Discovering Our Future Team is analyzing all your input and will use it as part of our overall process. After worship on Palm Sunday, we enjoyed a brunch and spent time dreaming together about the kind of church God wants us to have by the year 2021. The results of that meeting will also be used by the Discovering Our Future Team to determine four priorities that will guide our ministry into the future. We will report back to you when we complete that phase of the process. The final phase will be to interview community leaders and use their input to form recommendations to the Deacons and Elders. Remember, this whole process is congregational based, so your input and your prayers are very important.

The Deacons and Elders have approved a new Endowment Plan with all the supporting documents. Now, we will finish recruiting the committee and make a decision about which investment firm will handle the fund. Soon, you will receive information about how you can leave a legacy to carry on Christ's work through The Federated Church.

# Women's Bible Study



#### **Doctoral Studies**—Pastor Doug


