# The Pastor's Pen...



Sometimes I feel weary. I feel weary when I hear about the "nones" – those who claim no religious belief. I feel weary hearing about millennials leaving the church and thinking about all the energy exerted to keep them coming. This week I read about the "dones" – those who used to be involved in the church but who simply are done with the whole organizational mess.

Don't get me wrong, we ought to be worried about the "nones" and the "dones" and the millennials and our neighbors and friends, regardless of age or stage, who simply don't have room for Jesus. But sometimes in our focus on problem-solving we lose sight of the Holy Spirit. When that happens, we are not able to join in the work the Spirit is doing. And working, the Spirit is!

We saw and heard and felt the Spirit moving within us on Palm Sunday as we worshipped together and sang our praises to God. We rejoiced with the Spirit on Easter morning, welcoming the Risen Christ anew. We witnessed the Spirit working through us as we ministered to our neighbors at the Food Drop. We tasted of the Spirit in our fellowship at the Salad Luncheon. And we are seeing the Spirit at work in a new initiative – The Timothy Fellowship – that encourages young adults to discern their call to the ministry.

We are reminded of the Spirit at work among us as we celebrate Christ's Ascension and the initial coming of the Spirit on Pentecost. We remember how the Spirit empowered the disciples to spread the Word of Christ's Gospel far beyond their homeland, and begin to form the early church.

The Holy Spirit is also at work calling us to be the church, the gathered body of Christ meant to be a testimony to the world. One way we give expression to who we are in Christ is by following God's command to care for the world. We are also reminded that the church of Christ does not know borders and that the Spirit is doing mighty things in places like Pakistan, Iran, and the Middle East despite the persecution that Christians suffer there.

And while we often think about the Holy Spirit being most evident in the growth of the church, we are reminded that sometimes the Holy Spirit leads us on very different and difficult journeys, such as the closing of a church, the ending of a ministry, or the sudden change in a congregation's mission emphasis. It is often through death that new life springs forth.

The Holy Spirit is at work. There is much that our congregation can and should celebrate. When we realize that our task is to join what the Holy Spirit is already doing rather than engineering a revival, our weariness lifts and we are truly able to say or sing:

Pray we then, O Lord the Spirit on our lives descend in might; Let your flame break out within us, fire our hearts and clear our sight Till, white-hot in your possession, we, too, set the world alight. ("Praise the Spirit of Creation")

May the Ever-Active, Empowering and Inspiring Spirit of God fill you and move you this season. Pastor Doug





# **Parish Nursing Notes**

The ability to drive safely is a treasured skill that provides much self-sufficiency and independence. When that skill is questioned, it may be helpful to know that "highly trained Driver Rehab Specialists" are available in our community. That said, I was invited to a presentation by Lisa Cole, OTR, to introduce Stephen Ministers and me to the "Comprehensive



Driver Rehabilitation Services" offered by Lake Region Healthcare. The objective of the program is to determine if persons with a variety of medical conditions are safe to drive. The program includes a clinical phase and a behind the wheel phase. Candidates for this program would have a physician's referral, a valid learner's permit or driver's license and have not experienced loss of consciousness or seizure within the past 6 months. This driving assessment program is a benefit for persons with disabilities related to: spinal cord injury, dementia or Alzheimer's disease, stroke, cognitive impairment, psychological impairment, age-related impairments, Parkinson's, or amputation. The outcomes of the evaluation may include recommendations to continue/resume driving, refrain from driving at this time, participate in driver training, drive with adaptive equipment, or continue/ resume driving with restrictions.

The prophet Isaiah reminds God's people to "bring justice to the fatherless, plead the widow's cause." We have an opportunity to do just that.



Donna is working diligently to chip away at this bill, but it will take a long time to clear it completely.

# The Timothy Fellowship

"You have heard me teach things that have been confirmed by many reliable witnesses. Now teach these truths to other trustworthy people who will be able to pass them on to others."

2 Timothy 2:2 (The New Living Translation)

The Timothy Fellowship is a two-year internship designed to mentor young men and women considering a career in ministry by providing them with an opportunity to work in a congregational setting as they discern their call from God.

Every good leader has mentors – other leaders just ahead of where we are in our growth and our journey. And every leader also needs to be mentoring the next generation of leaders. This is the only way for discipleship to take on the multi-generational nature described by Paul in 2 Timothy 2:2.

Timothy was the Apostle Paul's apprentice in ministry. Theirs was a relationship that matured over time in three distinct phases:

#### **Phase One: Parenting**

In Paul's first letter to Timothy, he addresses him as "my true son in the faith." (1 Tim. 1:2, NLT). We first meet Timothy in Acts 16 when Paul is heading out on his second missionary journey: he stops in Lystra to pick up the young disciple who accompanies him, assists him, and serves as a Ministry Intern under him. Timothy's biological father was Greek, but no evidence is ever given that he was a Christian. So Paul filled the shoes of a spiritual parent to Timothy.

The Parenting phase will include a series of guided courses designed to deepen the Timothy Fellow's faith and to expand his or her knowledge of the Bible and of church ministry, and the completion of a specific project of interest to the Timothy Fellow and of benefit to the congregation.

#### **Phase Two: Pacesetting**

Pacesetting means being the example of what mature ministry looks like. In Paul's second letter to Timothy, he points out that, "you know what I teach, and how I live, and what my purpose in life is. You know my faith, my patience, my love, and my endurance..." (2 Tim. 3:10-11, NLT) Paul sets the pace with his own life and challenges Timothy to learn by keeping up and emulating Paul's lifestyle.

In the Pacesetting phase, the Timothy Fellow will gain practical experience in four areas of congregational life: Worship, Christian Education, Mission, and Pastoral Care.

#### **Phase Three: Partnering**

In the book of Romans, Paul makes a reference to Timothy: "Timothy, my fellow worker, sends you his greetings" (16:21). Timothy has gone from being a son to a student and now to being a colleague and a co-laborer. We spend plenty of time desiring and praying for more laborers, but perhaps not enough time investing in those with the potential to become our partners in the mission.

During the Partnering phase, the Timothy Fellow will be expected to discern his or her call to ministry through conversations, readings, and contact with our denominations and theological schools. The hope is that the Timothy Fellow will pursue further education or training (under care of our congregation), and become a full partner in ministry, actively serving Christ's church wherever he/she feels called by God.

We are excited to have Jordan Schiefert joining us as our first Timothy Fellow on or about June 1, 2015. Jordan is a recent graduate of Fergus Falls High School, and has been a faithful member of our worshipping community for several years and a key player in our praise band.

Funding for the Timothy Fellowship is provided by a grant from the Presbytery of Minnesota Valleys (PCUSA), a New Initiatives Grant from the Minnesota Conference (UCC), and by support from the Phoebe Loomer Fund.

# Greetings from Don & Maryjane Westra in Honduras!

Dear Friends at Federated:

Greetings from sunny warm Honduras. The next few months are the hottest time of the year and then comes the first rainy season in May. The second comes in November and December. A few weeks ago the surrounding mountains were green from the December rains but in just a few short weeks they have turned brown. The trees have been harvested so the mountains have no way of holding water. They have reforestation projects but illegal harvesting continues at a faster rate than reforestation.

Backing up: Don and I left Zimbabwe in 2013 when our visas (permission to work in the country, not the credit card) expired and were not renewed. We were sad to leave but welcomed a new work site in the same hemisphere as our family. We worked for a year and a half with gang youth in Tegucigalpa. In January 2015, we relocated to the community of Yoro in the Honduras state of Yoro. Yoro, Yoro. It translates as "I cry." I did cry at the thought of moving again, but it turned out to be a good move. (When will I stop trying to fight the Grand Plan?)

We are working in a vocational training center that trains students in automobile mechanics, industrial machining, welding, woodworking, culinary arts and soon a beauty school. They also teach basic education since many of the students have not graduated from high school. We have students as young as 14 years old and as old as 30. The school is a partnership between the Evangelical and Reformed Church and the Honduran government, neither of which have money! We have dedicated teachers and energetic students, mostly boys. We have a lovely setting and adequate space on a lovely campus surrounded by mountains. Our challenge is getting the classes adequately supplied so the students have a fighting chance to develop work skills. For example, the machine shop equipment is old and broken. Parts are difficult or impossible to find. There are few hand tools. Same story in the auto mechanic shop and wood shop. The Culinary Arts School has a lovely new building donated by a generous restaurateur in New Hampshire but we are challenged to have enough paying students to sustain it.

Don is painting and maintaining machine tools while at the same time writing proposals like crazy. I have been working on communications, web pages and organizing the opening of the beauty school which will be named Maria Jose Alvaro after the slain Miss Honduras of 2014.

In addition, we are challenged with opening a clinic in a small indigenous village. The clinic was established a number of years ago but was closed in 2011 for lack of funds. It is the only clinic for many miles. There are a few midwives in the village but the one we interviewed is very old and unable to read and write, so she can't pass a proficiency test now required by the government. The clinic is in need of visiting medical teams and medicines.

Don and I want to thank our wonderful church family for all the prayers and support you have given us these past five years in Zimbabwe and Honduras. We still don't know what our future holds but we do feel we have more work to do. We will be in Minnesota for the month of August and are anxious to see all of you! Honduras is in the neighborhood. We welcome visitors. We are especially in need of medical personnel and a team that would paint and clean a clinic and the beauty school in preparation to open its door. You will love the food served by the students of the culinary school.
