1 Thessalonians 2:12

'You're in time out!' In recent years, parents, teachers and childcare workers have used 'time out' as a form of discipline. It's really not new. To those old enough to recall, it's simply a variation of standing in a corner while looking at a blank wall.

I'm really not sure how effective it is as a deterrent to improper behavior, but it can be a deterrent to sin and self-centeredness. God wants us to take 'time out' for prayer, for worship, for communing together, for study of God's Word, and for service to each other.

This summer may be the perfect season to begin taking 'time outs.' When we are disciplined and diligent, we can make 'time out' a habitual part of each day. Taking time out to be with God is not a waste of time: it's not just staring at a blank wall: 'time out' is intentional time spent in the presence of the Redeemer, the author of life, the One who makes us whole and makes our joy complete.

THINGS TO KNOW FROM THE DCO—Rev. Dr. C. Edward Morgan, DCO

For over three months, our congregation, led by the Discovering Our Future Team, (Jean Bowman, Ben Schierer, Nathan Hoff, Connie Seltz, Renee Larsen, Ann Porter, Terry Harrington, Jake Gustafson, Karen Bush, Pastor Doug Dent, and Pastor Ed Morgan) has been praying, reflecting, and sharing about what we believe God would have us do in the coming five years. The first phase of that work is complete. The Deacons and Elders approved these priorities and the congregation reviewed them. Here are the priorities that emerged:

Offer inspiring and dynamic worship
Provide Biblically-based, cross-generational learning and fellowship opportunities
Engages with our community and serve the changing needs of our neighbors
Enhance our campus while preserving the historic nature of our sanctuary

Let me share some important clarifications. Because we list these four priorities, that does not mean that we do not continue to improve all the other ministries in our church. We gained a lot of information from the ministry assessment conducted at the beginning of this process, and staff and committees are using that information. Also, we have kept all the individual comments from approximately 150 people in our church. Those comments will now go to the teams and committees working on the above priorities. These big picture statements will lead to specific actions taken in the months and years ahead. Finally, we will report back to you the steps taken in the future.

At the beginning of this process, I shared that we are called to answer two questions: "God, who do you want us to be?" "God, what do you want us to do?" You have given us good input in answering both those questions. We believe we have answered the second question and we are close to putting the final touches on the first. We will share that answer soon.

Now, we need each and every one of our members to share their gifts and abilities to do God's work in this place. So, know that you have a special place in this church – you are important. We want our ministry to continue to be congregationally-centered and Holy Spirit-led. We have an exciting future.

It works together with hearing aids equipped with telecoils or t-coils to help hard of hearing people hear better. 

The first event is the **Day of Caring**, set for Tuesday, June 14th, organized by the United Way. On that day, meet at the United Way office (120 E. Washington Ave), and we'll be sent out together to do outdoor projects for the community and non-profit organizations in the Fergus Falls area. This event will run from 8AM – Noon; projects will include planting gardens, landscaping, spring cleanup, painting, washing windows and more! Lunch will be provided after the event. Let's have good representation at this special day! **Please note that this event requires that we register individually on-line.** To register, go to http://getconnected.uwotc.com/ (scroll down to June 14th Day of Caring event, click "volunteers", and complete the online form. More information is available at the Fergus Falls Chamber of Commerce website, or United Way website. Sign up as soon as possible!

The second event will be on June 30th, at the Lake Region Takes Root Community Garden, located on the west edge of Fergus Falls at 260 Kennedy Park Circle (just south of the Lake Region Healthcare Walk-in Clinic and west of the Home Depot). Food grown at the site will be used to serve Women, Infants & Children (WIC) clients of Otter Tail County. Any overage of food will be donated to area Food Shelf organizations. The development of the site, planting, maintenance, harvesting and distribution activities is a collaboration of partnerships with individuals and organizations that are committed to improving our local food system. We plan to be there from 9AM – Noon on June 30th, doing whatever needs to be done that day! Wear work clothes (and your Federated t-shirt!), and bring work gloves and any other tools you might find useful in that environment.
