We have this treasure in jars of clay to show that this all-surpassing power is from God and not from us.

2 Corinthians 4:7

We have a sterling silver coffee set at home that came from my Grandmother's house. It's quite old and beautifully made. It is easily the most expensive serving item in our home. We rarely use it, however, because it's no fun removing the tarnish that covers the silver with a black film.

Once the tarnish is removed, the coffee set gleams brighter than any container in the house. But left alone in the cupboard it is not long until the shiny silver set is hidden behind another layer of tarnish. The sad commentary of our valuable silver coffee set is that it sits on a shelf and gets very little use.

God is not looking for sterling silver coffee sets. God is looking for rough-and-tumble clay pots – the kind that can be used every day. God is looking for the kind of pots that don't need to be tucked away in a china closet, but can be set out into a crash-bang world, carrying with them the life of Christ. The church was meant to be a working kitchen, where well-worn pots are filled again and again to dispense their life-giving contents to a thirsty world.

As summer eases into autumn, The Federated Church is gearing up to offer you opportunities to be clay pots in a workaday world. This year there will be lots of educational events to help you discern God's will for your life (Bible studies, topical studies, marriage enrichment classes, parenting classes). We'll offer opportunities to serve at Salvation Army, Food Shelf, and around the church. We'll invite you to make a greater commitment to our faith family through your giving, your participation, and your service. We'll provide events to bring your friends and share with them the joy of being part of our family. And we'll have a lot of fun along the way!

2014 Mission Initiative

The Mission Initiative for 2014 is House of Hope in Zacapa, Guatemala. The House of Hope (Casa de Esperanza) is home to 26 children and youth. The aim of the House of Hope is to raise these children of God in a safe, loving, Christian environment, to educate them, and then send them out prepared for higher education or employment.

Funding for the House of Hope comes entirely from private donations. The need is great, the wish list is long. The Mission Committee has chosen to focus on school fees as our Mission Initiative for 2014. The House of Hope provides quality, Christian education through a combination of printed and online resources. The annual school fee for one student is \$330. Together, we can raise enough to cover the annual school fees for all 19 students – a total of about \$6300. We will be collecting donations all year long.

Trip to ValleyFair and State Fair

August 29th and 30th, the Jr/Sr high youth (including incoming 7th graders) will take a 2-day trip to the Twin Cities. We will leave Fergus on Friday morning and spend the day at ValleyFair; we'll spend the night, and hit the State Fair and Como Zoo on Saturday. If there is extra time, we will make a trip to the Mall of America. There will be photo scavenger hunts along the way!

We will be spending the night at a local church to keep the cost down as much as possible. The cost will include admission to ValleyFair, the State Fair, and meals. State Fair tickets are \$13 (\$10 if you pre-purchase before August 20th). ValleyFair tickets are \$45 at the door (\$34 if you pre-purchase more than 3 days in advance; it's possible to find coupons around town as well). Everyone is responsible for purchasing their own tickets, so feel free to pre-purchase at any time. Meals will typically run \$6-10 per meal. Total cost will be about \$100 for the weekend (more if you plan on trying every food offered at the State Fair; less if you pre-purchase tickets). If money is a hindrance, please contact the church office.

Youth will need to bring a sleeping bag and pillow, a change of clothes, sun-screen(!), money and a water bottle. We are also in need of a couple chaperones/drivers. Please contact the church office if you are interested.

Consecration Sunday is October 19, 2014.

To "consecrate" something means to declare it sacred or holy. It can also mean to set something aside for a special purpose. This year our stewardship campaign is about consecrating our lives and our resources to the service of God. So we are setting aside Sunday, October 19, 2014 as the day to rededicate ourselves to God's holy calling.

We will have one worship service that morning (10AM), followed by a congregational brunch (11AM). Designated Executive Presbyter Rick Carus from the Presbytery of MN Valleys will be our guest preacher that day; he will speak to us about being good and faithful stewards in God's kingdom.

This is a different kind of stewardship campaign, designed to foster discipleship, not just reach a financial goal. We will be asking each household to make an increase in their pledge as a sign of their renewed commitment to God's missions and ministries at The Federated Church.

Presbytery News

Your help is needed! The Presbytery office in Willmar is in need of volunteers to help upgrade the facilities with some long-overdue repairs. The various projects to be done include:

- Install new rain gutters and downspouts
- Install leveling pads under the two A/C units
- Install fencing around the A/C units
- Install a new front entrance door to the building
- Repair and repaint cedar siding on the front of the building
- Repaint round Presbyterian logo on front of building
- Re-shingle small roof over entrance to Presbytery building
- Repair, weatherize and repaint doors and entrances
- Replace outside light fixtures on front and side of building
- Repaint trim and former garage door opening on south side of the building

If you would be able to help with any of these projects, please contact Karen Lange at the Presbytery office. The work dates when we hope to meet and complete this work are August 13-15 (Wednesday through Friday).

Other aspects of the planned renovation project include addressing landscaping and water drainage issues around the building and grounds, as well as a new cement sidewalk and handicapped access to the building. A new sign is also in the works, to be installed following completion of all the other projects. Our hope is to complete this work before winter.
