



Every summer my parents took us to the coast of Maine for vacation. I loved wading and exploring the sea life in the tide pools. There is one, little sea creature called *Noto acmaea testudinalis*. It is a little gastropod animal having arched, non-spiraling shells with broad ventral openings. These little things are all over the world. They cling tenaciously to rocks and submerged timber. By the way, they are better known as Limpets.

What they do is scrape out a place on a rock and cling to it. They occasionally leave the rock to forage for food, but always return. The only danger they face in life is when they are not clinging to the rock.

Charles Haddon Spurgeon made use of the limpet in the following illustration.

"Our little friend the limpet does not know much, but he clings. He cannot tell us much about what he is clinging to, is not acquainted with the geological formation of the rock, but he clings! He has found something to cling to; and with his little bit of knowledge, he uses it to cling to the rock of his salvation; it is the limpet's life to cling. Thousands of God's people have no more faith than this; they know to cling to Jesus with all their heart and soul and this suffices. Jesus Christ is to them a Savior strong and mighty, and they cleave to him as to a rock unmovable and immutable."

The Bible often speaks of God as a rock to which we should cling. "In God is my salvation and my glory: the rock of my strength, and my refuge, is in God" (Psa. 62:7).

"I cannot comprehend the nature of God, but I believe" (Job. 9:10). God is beyond my comprehension. Where my feeble understanding fails, faith takes over. I need no deep and complicated explanation of my God in heaven in order to have a faith that keeps me in the cleft of the Rock of Ages. "From the end of the earth will I cry unto thee, when my heart is overwhelmed: lead me to the rock that is higher than I" (Psa. 61:2).

Frank Marion Davis wrote a hymn entitled "O Rock in the Desert" which begins:

O Rock in the desert, I fly unto thee,

When tempest and storms sweep the sky.

I hide in the cleft that was riven for me,

For safety on Thee I rely.

God is our rock and our redeemer, our safety in life's troubles. The Moral of this story? Be a spiritual Limpet!

Local Mission

Thank you for your continued generosity with the Local Mission Fund! Those who are helped by this fund are extremely grateful for the extra support they receive during tough times. According to our policy, we are able to help each family or individual three times during a 12 month period, with up to \$100 a time, depending on funds. We assist with food, utilities, rent, and, in emergency situations, a night at a hotel. Donations can be put in the offering plate with Local Mission Fund in the memo line or dropped off in the church office. Thank you!!

During the month of June, we were unable to help any families or individuals from the local mission fund used for food, household goods, rent or utilities. As of July 24, we have helped **5** families or individuals with **\$216.96** towards food, household goods, rent or utilities.

We keep a supply of soap, lotion, toothpaste, conditioner, toothbrushes, toilet paper, etc. on hand at the church to give to people who come in needing assistance. If you have extra at your home, bring them in! We'll give them away.

"Healthy Years: Helping older adults Here's how it is done: lead happier, healthier lives" June 2017 Volume 15-Number 6 has some suggestions for those who are feeling stressed. Anyone not feeling • stressed? The helpful suggestions are available to all who breathe! That would make the technique free too. It is called "Coherent Breathing."

- Sit comfortably upright. Take a few breaths allowing your belly to balloon outwards.
- Exhale to the count of 6.
- Take several normal breaths. and then again focus on exhaling to the count of 6.
- Let the breaths be smooth, and feel the body relaxing.
- Switch your focus by inhaling to the count of 6.
- Again, allow your body to breathe in and out naturally several times. Focus onsic-count inhalation every few breaths.
- Combine these by inhaling for six and exhaling for six. It is not necessary for every breath in and out to be a six-count. The idea is be relaxed and focused. but not forced. Conscious deep breathing can improve your well-being.
