Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! Now what do we do? Our Lenten Journey is over. We traveled to the Upper Room on maundy Thursday with Jesus and his disciples. We heard Jesus say those still powerful, effective words: "This is my body broken for you" (Mt. 26:28). We traveled to the foot of the cross on Good Friday and heard Jesus utter a lonely cry of abandonment, "My God, My God, why have you forsaken me" (Mk. 15:34)? We heard the words of finality that Jesus spoke with his last breath, "It is finished!" (Jn. 19:30), paying in full the price for our sin which separates us from God. And we traveled to the empty tomb to witness the story of the women who found it empty. We heard the words of the angel at the tomb, "He is not here, but has risen!" (Lk. 24:6). The final, culminating Day of Resurrection is over. Now what do we do?

Easter is more than just one day. Easter is an "every Sunday" celebration during which we come together to receive the fruit of the cross and resurrection of Jesus, the forgiveness of sins and the certainty of eternal life with God. Easter is also an "every day" celebration in which we live each day trusting in God through Christ, knowing that Jesus is "the resurrection and the life" (Jn. 11:25) for us.

So, what do we do as we go forth from the empty tomb? We should follow the example of the women who found the tomb empty. Mary Magdalene, Joanna, and Mary the mother of James "remembered the words, and returning from the tomb they told all these things to the eleven and to all the rest" (Lk. 24:8-9). They went forth from the tomb changed by the resurrection of Jesus. They went forth from the tomb to bring an "every day" witness of God's power over sin, death, hell, and evil to the world.

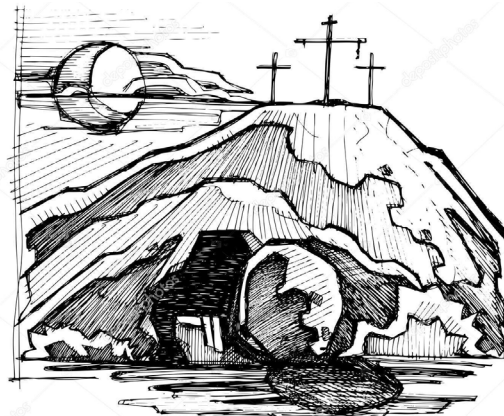
And where do we go once we leave the empty tomb? We should follow the example of the disciples. After Jesus walked through locked doors and appeared to the eleven disciples and showed himself to Thomas, seven of the eleven went back to their fishing business (Jn. 21:1-14). They returned to their vocations and took the witness of the resurrection with them. They lived in the joy of the resurrection of Jesus while carrying out their ordinary, daily labors and responsibilities.

The women and the disciples were "every day" witnesses, participating in the resurrection of Jesus wherever they happened to be. As those who profess Jesus resurrected, as those who are baptized and believe, we have the hope of eternal life and the joy of the resurrection living inside of us. And like the women and the disciples, we have vocations to which God calls us. Most of us do not rely on fishing for a living, but we are called to "fish for people" (Mt. 4:19), to cast the good news about Jesus on the waters so that others may be drawn to him and to God's salvation. Each of us is a husband or wife, a father or a mother, a son or a daughter, a colleague, a friend, a neighbor: each of these callings comes with a set of odd duties and responsibilities. As Christians, forgiven and redeemed by God's grace, we can wrap these daily duties and responsibilities in the joy, love, peace, and forgiveness of Jesus. And when we do, others will notice and God will bless our faithful work by giving us opportunities to "tell all these things to all the rest" (Lk. 24:9).

Now, we go forth from Easter Sunday and the celebration of the empty tomb to live as God's children, loved, restored, set free in Christ. Now we go forth empowered by God's Spirit living and active within us to live in the joy of the resurrection as "every day" witnesses.

## Guatemala Mission Team

The newly formed Guatemala Mission Team held our first fundraiser on March 14th during the Lenten speaker and dinner series. It was a great success with all-hands-on-deck throughout the evening! The team would like to thank the Federated Church family for their support of the youth—we are on our way to reaching our goals! Please pray for the mission team as we continue to work together to make this trip a positive and faith-growing experience.

Our next event will be a cake auction on April 15th during the Fellowship Hour. We have some GREAT cake makers lined up to bring their specialty items—so be prepared to out-bid your fellowship church members! After this event, we will be going out into the greater community at restaurants for some fundraising events—dates TBD.

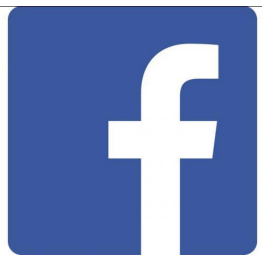
ON a side note, I received Greg Miller's missionary update letter recently, and wanted to highlight what he said about our team that went this past February. (Greg is the director of the House of Hope Orphanage and also runs a ministry where he trains and supports pastors in mountain villages.) He is quoted as saying: "We had our second team (from Fergus Falls, MN,) the Federated Church, of the year come in

February and again, what a blessing. They installed eight stoves in two different villages, Plan Del Morro and Barrio Nuevo. In Barrio Nuevo, not one of the stoves was in an easy place to get to, we had to carry the pieces up and down the mountains to get to the houses. Praise God that the team was strong and the villagers helped us, we could have never gotten the stoves delivered if it wasn't for the help. It's such a blessing to watch the folks as their stove gets installed and be able to pray with them after it's installed."

The House of Hope also recently received the generous donation (from a church in the United States) of 99 solar panels which were installed shortly after we left. The hope is that these solar panels will eventually eliminate most electricity costs for the orphanage, which has multiple buildings and a large monthly utility bill. Greg and the rest of the people there, adults and kids alike, are finding multiple ways to become self-sufficient right at the site. Vegetables, fruit, and other nutritional plants (such as Moringa) are grown throughout the grounds, chickens are kept for egg-laying, and several manmade ponds provide tilapia for their own food as well as for a side income. It is an impressive venture that includes the older youth and allows them opportunities to help support the work at HOH.

## Local Mission

Thank you for your continued generosity with the Local Mission Fund! Those who are helped by this fund are extremely grateful for the extra support they receive during tough times. According to our policy, we are able to help each family or individual three times during a 12 month period, with up to \$100 a time, depending on funds. We assist with food, utilities, rent, and, in emergency situations, a night at a hotel. Donations can be put in the offering plate with Local Mission Fund in the memo line or dropped off in the church office. Thank you!

During March, we were able to help 3 families or individuals place a roof over their head through the local mission fund. We gave a total of \$555.00 for two nights at the Super 8 and for an individual facing a difficult situation with rent.

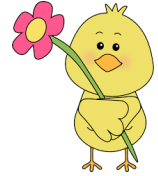
Men's Bible Study meets on Mondays at noon for one hour. They will be diving into a study of Revelation. All men are invited! Friends of Federated are invited, too!

## Mission Committee

One Great Hour of Sharing is Sunday, April 22, 2018. Have you ever taught a child to fold their fingers inside their hands and say the rhyme, "Here is the church, here is the steeple, open the doors and see all the people?" The wiggling fingers teach children (and adults, too!) that the church is not the building, but the people gathered for worship and fellowship. There something else in this children's rhyme: as the child breaks open their hands to reveal the "people" they move their fingers back and forth, often as fast as they can. This simple move reminds us that the church is the energy and actions that share the love of Christ. When a disaster strikes, people give, volunteer, and pray so that those impacted receive help and hope: this is the church in action!

When poverty and violence cause hunger and people respond to the need and address its root causes: this is the church in action!

When injustice falls on those who are vulnerable, and people join hands with one another and lift their voices against the interests of power: this is the church in action!
