

My Grandfather used to joke: "I hate change! I prefer dollar bills." All joking aside, change is tough to take, and we have had more than our fair share of changes this past year with COVID-19.

Jean-Baptist Alphonse Karr penned the phrase "The more things change, the more they stay the same." The 2020-2021 version might be, "The more things change...the more things change!"

Bob Hostetler, a contributing editor for Guideposts magazine, wrote an article entitled "Embracing Change" (June/July 2021). In it, Bob says that change can be good or bad, fun or difficult, but it will always cause stress. He goes on to say that our response to change (how we handle the stress it causes) is what makes the change a positive or negative experience.

Bob asserts that if we can "embrace the new state of affairs, rather than resisting it, we become agents of change rather than its victims." He also offers four prayers for embracing change.

"The Lord is with you." Long ago, the young nation of Israel faced transformation. An angel appeared to a backcountry nobody named Gideon, who was hiding from Israel's enemies. Perhaps with a note of irony, the angel greets Gideon with these words: "The Lord is with you, mighty warrior" (Judges 6:12). That phrase, turned slightly from greeting into prayer, reminds us that even when we may not feel like mighty warriors, God is with us and (more importantly) for us during times of transition.

"With your help..." David faced daunting challenges: giants, murderous kings, a rebellious son, armed conflicts, family squabbles, a stubborn people to govern. In a verse per-

haps written after surviving King Saul's attacks, David sang, "With your help I can advance against a troop; with my God I can leap over a wall" (Psalm 18:29). This prayer encourages and strengthens us, a reminder that whether we survive or thrive in change, God supplies all we need.

"Let is be." What did a teenage peasant girl named Mary say when she learned that God had chosen her to give birth to the long-awaited Messiah? "I am the servant of the Lord; let it be to me according to your word" (Luke 1:38). Mary's humble acceptance was an act of great faith amid dramatic shifts for her – and the world. Her words suggest a powerful prayer: "Let it be to me according to your will." By treating change as a way to enlist in God's wise and loving purposes, we defuse apprehension and activate the miraculous.

"Make us bold." When Christians faced persecution during the first century, they did not pray for things to stay the same. They said, "Give us, your servants, great boldness in preaching your word" (Acts 4:29). They prayed for courage to meet what lay ahead. That is the spirit we need when we face changes...a spirit that does not shrink from change but instead embraces it, knowing that God can use us – and our shifting circumstances – come what may.

Change is constant. Inevitable. But with prayer, God – who never changes – can give us the grace to change and lead us into the future of God's choosing.

Be agents of change, trusting God to take you through it!
