The end of a matter is better than its beginning, and patience is better than pride. Ecclesiastes 7:8

I find it very hard to let things go. I'm the type of person who will try everything possible to keep something from failing. The more personal and important the venture, the harder I work to keep it going. But some things I can't change or fix, and so I must let them go.

Federated Church supported The House of Hope orphanage in Zacapa, Guatemala for sixteen years. In that time, we sponsored 13 mission teams, sent 70 people, and spent nearly 2,200 hours in country. We visited dozens of mountain villages and installed stoves to improve the lives of 30 families. We've deepened relationships within our own faith family, met some remarkable Guatemalans, and played with some amazing kids. We've also seen first-hand how tough life can be in Central America.

People for Missions, the parent organization for House of Hope, responding to changes by the Guatemalan government, sold the House of Hope mission to a new organization, Horizons. I know nothing about this new parent company, except that they will not accept mission teams. It's hard to let go of this important mission. It's heartbreaking to think I won't see the HOH kids again. It's painful to admit that, after 14 trips, I might not visit Guatemala in the foreseeable future.

The writer of Ecclesiastes says that "the end of the matter is better than its beginning." We ended well at House of Hope. This chapter of our congregation's life is over now, and I must accept it, and I am comforted by the knowledge that we

did GOOD work there. We made a DIFFERENCE to those mountain families. We RECEIVED so much from our trips, more than we gave, I know. We DID as Christ commanded: we went and worked with our brothers and sisters in Guatemala. For all these things, I am thankful.

The writer also says, "patience is better than pride." I'm not much good at being patient, but I know that God will provide another opportunity for us to do good work - God's work - where it is needed.

I want to thank all who:

- Traveled to House of Hope for their time, their hard work, and their faithful witness
- Purchased stoves to ease life for families in the mountains
- Supported our youth so that they could experience a new culture and share their faith abroad
- Listened as the teams told their life-changing stories
- Prayed for the teams' safety
- Explored ways to send needed supplies (uniforms, laptops) to the House of Hope school
- Sponsored a child at House of Hope

Federated Church is a hard-working, faithful group of people. I know it won't be long before we find new people to serve.

Breathing With God

A Spiritual Formation Course

An Adult human breathes 12-20 times per minute, or between 17,000-30,000 times per day. Such breathing typically occurs without conscious thought or our willing it to happen.

Breathing with God, however, is not so automatic. Breathing with God means living in communion with God, acting in partnership with God for the redemption of the creation, and aligning our human will with God's purpose. When human beings find themselves out of step, out of sync, and out of breath before God, this breathlessness leads to a sense of alienation from God and an empty existence. We constantly struggle to breathe with God.

One goal of Christian discipleship is to discover how to breathe more fully with God and God's purpose for our lives.

Christian disciples:

- INSPIRE breathe in God, who is the source of our life
- ASPIRE breathe like Jesus and live in a Christ-like way
- CONSPIRE breathe with the Holy Spirit for the reclamation of the world

You are invited to work with Pastor Doug to discern how to better breathe with God, both as individuals and as a congregation.

Together we will:

- Learn spiritual practices to enhance our breathing with God
- Discover how personality preferences shape how we breathe with God
- Explore the spiritual gifts with which we breathe most freely
- Consider the role of the Holy Spirit in our breathing
- Commit to be a people and a church who breathe out God's purpose!
