

Expansive. That's the word I would choose to describe events surrounding the Ascension of Jesus and the First Pentecost. In the Gospels, Jesus often spoke of his leaving and of the Holy Spirit coming to help the disciples spread the good news of God's expansive love for the world.

In the book of Acts, Jesus gives more details: "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (1:8). He is then lifted to heaven. The disciples stand there watching him go, even after a cloud obscures him from their sight. Two men appear beside them, dressed in white robes (probably angels), and ask them, "Why do you stand there looking up to heaven?" (1:11). The implication is that there is much work to be done, here and now, and their gaze needs to be more horizontal than vertical.

In the very next chapter, the promised Holy Spirit descends as a "mighty wind" and as "tongues of fire" upon the disciples (2:2-3). Both wind and fire are signs of power, and the Holy Spirit empowers the disciples to share the good news about Jesus by speaking in the languages of those visiting Jerusalem for the Pentecost festival. Each one heard them speaking in the native language of each and they were amazed and astonished (2:6-7).

Jesus' words at the Ascension determined the mission field, expanding outward from Jerusalem, to Samaria, and to the ends of the earth.

The Spirit's work at Pentecost expanded God's good news of salvation to the people of "every nation under heaven" (2:5).

Then the apostle Peter spoke to the crowd, driving home the expansiveness of God's Kingdom: "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ so that your sins may be forgiven; and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. For the promise is for you, for your children, and for all who are far away, everyone whom the Lord our God calls to him" (2:38-39).

Our God is expansive by nature. God extended God's Self to us in Jesus Christ, coming to us in our time of need. Jesus extended himself to us by sending the

Holy Spirit to be with us forever. Now, God calls us to be expansive, extending ourselves to those closest to us and to those far away with the good news of God's love for all people.

God's mission never changes. God's goal is nothing short of the full redemption of the world. This, then, is our mission, too. We are to speak the good news of salvation to all people. We are to show the love of Christ to all people. We are to work with the Spirit for the transformation of all people. We are called to be expansive people, open to the Spirit nudging us outward, to reach more people for God's Kingdom.

I encourage you, as expansive people, to reach beyond yourselves. Find a need and meet it. Speak good news of love to another person. Perform an act of kindness in the name of Jesus. And may God's Holy Spirit guide you!

Guatemala

I received Greg Miller's missionary update letter recently, and wanted to highlight what he said about our team that went this past February. (Greg is the director of the House of Hope Orphanage and also runs a ministry where he trains and supports pastors in mountain villages.) He is quoted as saying:

"We had our second team (from Fergus Falls, MN,) the Federated Church, of the year come in February and again, what a blessing. They installed eight stoves in two different villages, Plan Del Morro and Barrio Nuevo. In Barrio Nuevo, not one of the stoves was in an easy place to get to, we had to carry the pieces up and down the mountains to get to the houses. Praise God that the team was strong and the villagers helped us, we could have never gotten the stoves delivered if it wasn't for the help. It's such a blessing to watch the folks as their

stove gets installed and be able to pray with them after it's installed."

The House of Hope also recently received the generous donation (from a church in the United States) of 99 solar panels which were installed shortly after we left. The hope is that these solar panels will eventually eliminate most electricity costs for the orphanage, which has multiple buildings and a large monthly utility bill. Greg and the rest of the people there, adults and kids alike, are finding multiple ways to become self-sufficient right at the site. Vegetables, fruit, and other nutritional plants (such as Moringa) are grown throughout the grounds, chickens are kept for egg-laying, and several manmade ponds provide tilapia for their own food as well as for a side income. It is an impressive venture that includes the older youth and allows them opportunities to help support the work at HOH.


