

Be thankful in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you who belong to Christ Jesus. 1 Thessalonians 5:18

Most of us know that saying "please" and "thank you" go a long way in this world. They show our respect and our gratitude. In the same way, "please" and "thank you" go a long way with God.

Most of us are pretty good at the please" part: "Please, God, answer my prayer! Please God, give me this thing. Please God heal my friend." We may not be as good at remembering to say "thank you" to God for the many blessing God provides.

So how do we — how can we — sincerely say "thanks" to God? We can show God our gratitude with small, everyday actions. Here are eight suggestions:

Go to Church. Celebrate Worship. Celebrate God's Word. Celebrate Communion. Did you know that one of the words of communion – eucharist – comes from the Greek for "thanksgiving" or "gratitude"? When the Church asks, "What is this sacrament called?" The answer is "it is an action of thanksgiving to God." As an "action," going to church implies movement. We must do something, not just stand or sit there. Without our actively taking part in worship — praying with others, offering our gifts to God, receiving Communion - then we're pretty much like that child blurting a fast and nearly thoughtless "thank you" just to appease Mom. Brig your whole self to church. Throw your whole self – heart, mind, soul and strength – into worshiping God.

Do what Jesus told us to do. Jesus said, 'Abide in Me'. Dwell with him. Hang out with him. To show your ultimate gratitude, spend some time with the Jesus. Maybe by studying God's Word, maybe on a prayer walk, maybe in silence, maybe through community service. Find ways to be Jesus' disciple every day.

Find time to Breathe. Stop the busyness! We work so hard that it's easy to forget to put on the brakes. Take time for examination and reflection. Take time to give thanks. Create some space to be with God, to listen for God's still, small voice, and to get in touch with the One who is the source of your life. Taking a moment to breathe and to center yourself in God will make the rest of the day better.

Thank people God has used in your life. We should thank those who poured themselves into our lives. Write them a note, send them a text, give them a call. Tell them, "Thank you for being a gift from God! Thanks for being my teacher, my parents, my friend." Thank them for their investment in you. Tell them specifically how God used them to provide for, encourage, and strengthen you.

Help the least of these. We are blessed beyond measure and commissioned by God to be a blessing to others. Find a way to reach out and share God's blessings with others. When we focus on serving, helping, and loving those in need, we are acting in a way that is pleasing to God. Serving is a great way to say "thank you" for all God's blessings.

Take note. Stop and see how God is working in your world. Take time to jot down God's actions, communications, inspirations. Find a way to 'take note' that's easy to keep track of, and hard to cheat on. Jotting down a few things at the end of every day can be a prayer of thanksgiving. Why? Because you know the One who is the source of all goodness, blessings, grace and love.

Don't put a gift from God in a drawer. Sometimes we receive a gift from a family member or friend and quietly tuck it away in a dresser drawer. It's not something we need, want, know how to use, or even like. When we do that with a gift from God it runs counter to what Jesus taught in the Parable of the Talents (Matthew 25:14-23). Use what God gives you! Pay attention to the talents God has given you, develop them, and use them to help others. In this way, God is glorified.

Care for those you love. One way we can we love our brothers and sisters in the Lord is the care for them and spend time with them. "And let us not neglect our meeting together, as some people do, but encourage one another" (Hebrews 10:25). We all have people in our lives who need care. Don't neglect their need, rather fulfill it! Celebrate with them. Mourn with them. Work with them. Show thanks to God by caring for the ones God put in your life.

So, in this month of November, amid the turkey and stuffing and pumpkin pie, remember that Thanksgiving is at its best when it is giving thanks to God.
