Pastor's Pen

Robert F. Smith, the Founder, CEO & Chairman of Vista Equity Partners (a venture capital firm) gave the commencement address at Morehouse College (Atlanta, GA) last May. During his speech Smith, a billionaire, pledged \$40 million dollars to pay off the student debt of the graduating seniors. David A. Thomas, president of Morehouse College, calls this a "liberation gift" that will be "life-changing" for these students. I doubt any of the students will remember anything Smith said, but I'm, quite sure they will forever remember his generosity and his lifeaffirming gift.

Our God also offers us liberating and life changing gifts. In Jesus Christ we have the remission of our sins and the chance to live new and better lives. We have hope for a brighter tomorrow and the promise of a world where peace and justice reign.

How do you put a value on such gifts? What is hope worth? What is freedom worth? Such gifts are inestimable. Such gifts are exactly what the world desperately craves. God's church is still the only place to obtain these gifts. No other source can offer us the freedom, hope, and love that God offers us in Jesus Christ.

The mission of the church – God's mission – is to make sure that every person knows they are loved and valued. Our value extends far beyond what we can produce in a lifetime. Our value far outstrips our meager skills. Our value is far and away the gift of God's grace.

Since this is stewardship month, I must ask: what value do you assign to God's grace? As you consider your pledge to our congregation, think of God's mission for us. How might we tell of God's love and grace and hope more successfully if you made a pledge this year? How many more people might be reached through one of our compassion ministries if you increased your pledge? How might the needs of our community be met if you made a "liberation gift" like Robert Smith? None of us has Smith's resources, but Mike Shol really challenged us to make small changes that can have a big impact. Mike pledged to cut down on his chewing tobacco habit and to use some of the money he saves to raise his pledge for 2020. Such a change will not only make a huge difference in Mike's life and health but will also benefit the Fergus Falls community through our congregation's increased ability to reach out in Christ's name.

Mike's challenge is one we can all manage. We had 83 households pledge last year.

• If each household skipped one coffee drink each week (\$5) and pledged it to the church, it would mean an additional \$21,580 for programs and services.

• If each household waived one meal at a restaurant each month (\$40) and pledged it to the church, it would mean an additional \$39,840 for programs and services.

• If each household cut out one tank of gas each month (\$60) and pledged it to the church, it would mean an additional \$59,760 for programs and services.

These are changes which are easily managed and which yield great dividends. Help us spread the good news about God's liberating gifts for the world. Make your pledge today!

Local Mission

Thank you for your continued generosity with the Local Mission Fund! Those who are helped by this fund are extremely grateful for the extra support they receive during tough times. We assist with food, utilities, rent, and, in emergency situations, a night at a hotel. New School Year:

The 2019-2020 year is off to a great start! By the time this newsletter reaches households, all child and youth activities will be in their second month. Sunday school, Kidz Club, confirmation, and senior high youth group are wonderful opportunities for friendships, fun, and learning to have a relationship with God! We have experienced adult volunteer support and awesome young people participating in these growing ministries!

Adult Ministries: Adults have opportunities for growth and learning too, with a Sunday morning class on "The Artist's Bible". This group will explore religious masterpieces with Pastor Doug, and study the Bible story each painting tells. Both women and men have Bible study groups that meet on Tuesday mornings—the men are studying Romans and the women are studying the book of Acts.

Kidz Club: Our theme this fall, "CATCH THE SPIRIT!" explores how the Holy Spirit guided and empowered the apostles to begin spreading the gospel of Jesus Christ to others. We will be learning about Christians around the world and crafts that celebrate different countries. Feel free to join us—we love meeting new friends!

Sunday School: We meet each Sunday morning as a group in the choir room to learn a song with Brian and share prayer concerns, and then we break into our classes. We are following the story of the apostles and their adventures of faith as they began to share the truth of Jesus Christ. Come check out our classes!

Confirmation: Our 7th and 8th grade students meet every Wednesday after school for class, and our 9th grade students meet every Wednesday at 6:30pm. We follow a three-

year plan which lays out the study of the Old Testament, the New Testament, and a final year which integrates biblical study along with theology and a deeper understanding of our journey of faith. Our annual retreat comes up on Oct. 4-6 and promises to be a joyful weekend!

Senior High Youth Group: Our 9th through 12th grade students meet each week on Wednesdays from 7:30-9:00pm in the youth room downstairs for games, thoughtful discussions, and topics pertaining to our Christian faith. We periodically do special events such as movies, lock-ins, and service projects, and sometimes we even gather for game nights at the Dents. We are always happy to include new friends, and enjoy incorporating new people and ideas to the group! Our youth are such a talented and busy group of individuals-you probably see them playing soccer, football, running cross-country, playing in the marching band, singing in the choirs, shooting hoops and pucks, and any number of other activities.
