"...if [God] did not spare the ancient world when he brought the flood on its ungodly people, but protected Noah, a preacher of righteousness, and seven others...then the Lord knows how to rescue the godly from trial..." (2 Peter 2:5, 9a)

"The world is opening up," said the headlines. After 18 months of the pandemic, I really wanted that to be true. We've all wondered, "What will life look like on the other side?"

Centuries ago, Noah had a crisis, forcing him into "lockdown" on a boat filled with animals. When the boat finally came to rest on dry land, Noah received a brand-new introduction to his world.

As we look at ways to safely "get back to God's business," we can take a few lessons from Noah's experience in lockdown.

- 1. REFLECTION: *empathize rather than analyze*. Four million dead from COVID-19 around the world is a devastating tragedy! Yet, like Noah, we remain people of hope and preachers of righteousness (2 Peter 2:5). Jesus said that sin and suffering allow us to see God working miracles (John 9:3,). A crisis is not the time to debate God's involvement; it is the time to help your neighbor. Maybe the pandemic offered you the chance to be somebody's miracle.
- 2. GLORY: give thanks and an offering to God. Noah's first act when opening the ark was to offer God a sacrifice of thanksgiving, acknowledging God's rainbow of grace. "In everything give thanks" (2 Thessalonians 5:18) may be difficult to do in a pandemic, but God always deserves our praise for God's faithfulness to us.
- 3. REALISM: recognize anticipation and apprehension. When the floodwaters abated, Noah sent out a raven, then a dove. When the dove returned with a branch in its beak, then it was safe to open the doors. We may feel a rush to reopen, but we need to proceed with caution,

reopening slowly and safely, balancing our excitement and our anxiety.

- 4. TRUTHTELLING: present the Gospel. The miracle of deliverance lingered with the descendants of Noah, but it did not take long for faithlessness to set in (think, the tower of Babel). "As the days of Noah were, so also will the coming of the Son of Man be" (Matthew 24:37). Now, more than ever, it is time to present a Christ-centered approach to life which can offset a fearful world and its divisiveness.
- 5. INNOVATION: use digital platforms for God's glory. Noah had never built a boat before. Why would he need one living in the desert? So, he learned how, adding new skills to his resume. The pandemic forced us to update our audio-video equipment and to figure out how to offer online worship. This unanticipated blessing kept us connected, even as we stayed safety apart. With that success, we are feeling bold enough to offer online giving. Check out the Stewardship information about Tithe.ly on page 6 and how you can support or ongoing ministries.
- 6. VICTORY: stop wanting to go back to normal. "So the LORD scattered them abroad from there [the Tower of Babel] over the face of all the earth" (Genesis 11:8). Now they could replenish the earth, as God commissioned them to do. From setbacks come springboards. Church buildings, so long closed to members, now yield new church ministries opened to the world. God's rainbow of grace shines again!

We cannot go back to what we had or did before. Pre-pandemic ministry no longer works. Intentional interaction must replace silent spectators. New ways of being Christ to the world must replace passive bystanders. Let's give our world a brand-new introduction to Jesus. Let's give the word a reason to smile again.

2022 Stewardship Campaign

The Stewardship Campaign for 2022 kicks off on Sunday, September 26, 2022. Our theme in this 150th year of Federated Church's ministry in the community is "Praising God's Faithfulness." Drawing on Hebrews 10:23, we are "holding fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for God who promised is faithful."

We are asking each household to consider a 15% increase to their pledge in honor of our 150th year of ministry. This equates to an additional \$15 for every \$100 pledged or an additional \$150 for every \$1,000 pledged in 2021. Will you accept our anniversary challenge? If everyone accepted, it would mean an additional \$60,000 for our ministries.

We are also asking households who did not pledge in 2021 to consider a pledge for 2022. As we emerge from the pandemic and re-start active ministry in the community again, we need everyone's support.

Stewardship Sunday is October 17, 2021. Please make your pledge by that date. Thank you for your continued support of Federated Church's mission and ministries.

Endowment Committee

Heritage Grant Applications being accepted through October 31, 2021

Statement of Purpose: Federated Church honors the gifts and bequests of those who have gone before us by dedicating the spirit and income of the Endowment to the mission and needs of our church, our community, and our world.

Who may request funding? The Board of Deacons and Elders; committees of the Federated Church; a special Church committee or task force; ministerial or professional staff members; or a group, agency or charity not affiliated with the Church, if sponsored by any of the above.

Grant Criteria: Distributions from the Endowment shall be used to advance the presence and mission of the church in the lives of people within out:

- Local church and congregation, including the maintenance, repair, renovation, and new construction of facilities; and the acquisition of special equipment and supplies;
- Local and regional community, including support for the victims of natural disasters, relief for the poor and destitute, and assistance to ecumenical needs and projects;
- Global community, with special emphasis on responding to poverty, neglect, abuse, homelessness, illness, malnutrition, exploitation, and crime; education, including Christian education; recognizing and nurturing gifts and attributes; and nurturing the faith.

Forms and Deadlines: The Heritage Grant application form and information is available on the church website (under "Resources") or in the church office. Requests for funding should be submitted by October 31, 2021.

Updated Safety Protocols at Federated Church

With the uptick in COVID-19 cases in Otter Tail County, the Deacons & Elders made the decision to update the safety protocols as follows:

- Face coverings are required inside Federated Church for all persons.
- · Face coverings will be provided for those who desire one.
- · Face coverings are required for anyone engaging in public singing.
- Spatial distancing of 3-feet is recommended.
- The Church nursery is closed.
- Persons who are sick or who have flu-like symptoms are requested to stay home.

- Hand sanitizing stations are available at everv entrance.
- Wash hands frequently.
- Keep face coverings on when not eating at coffee hour or at meals.
- Four persons per table in Fellowship Hall.
- Power Point for worship instead of bulletins or hymnals.
- Pre-packaged communion cups instead of passing communion trays.
- A donation box in the narthex instead of passing offering plates.
- Proper ventilation of all inhabited spaces (AC and open windows when possible).


