New Year's Eve



"God's readiness to give and forgive is now public. Salvation's available for everyone! We're being shown how to turn our backs on a godless, indulgent life, and how to take on a God-filled, God-honoring life. This new life is starting right now, and is whetting our appetites for the glorious day when our great God and Savior, Jesus Christ, appears. He offered himself as a sacrifice to free us from a dark, rebellious life into this good, pure life, making us a people he can be proud of, energetic in goodness." (Titus 2:11-14, *The Message*)

For some reason, this passage from Titus keeps popping up: in my daily devotion, with my online text-of-the-day, as one of the suggested scriptures for Christmas Eve. For some only-known-to-the-Spirit reason, God wants me to hear this scripture this season.

I chose Eugene Peterson's translation of this passage because the words are so hope-filled. God's readiness to forgive is public. Salvation is available to everyone! We are being shown how to live a God-filled, God-honoring life. This new life starts right now! It is whetting our appetite for the day when Jesus appears.

So, what do all these hope-filled words mean? Most versions of this text say that God's forgiveness is *revealed* or is now *appearing*. Peterson uses the word "public." The original Greek is *epiphany*, a word with two meanings. One meaning is the coming of light into darkness, as dawn gradually emerges from the darkness of night.

Another meaning is the sudden appearance through divine intervention. God intervened on behalf of all humankind through Jesus. This coming of Christ in human form is called the *incarnation*. All too frequently, the incarnation is restricted to the actual birth of Jesus during the Christmas season; but the incarnation implies the entirety of Jesus' life: birth, ministry, life, death, and resurrection. God comes to us

in human form to live and work and die and rise again for us. The purpose of the incarnation is the salvation of all humankind. And that is great and glorious, good news for everyone!

That salvation is ongoing as Christ's Gospel fills the world and people come to the lightness of Christ's love. And through God's Spirit, we are being taught how to live lives worthy of that gospel. There is a sense of light growing in darkness, as a fuller understanding of Christ's grace grows in human hearts and minds.

We live in a "liminal" state, on the cusp of something, at the threshold of something great, as a new era emerges. God's Kingdom is both *here* and *not yet*. We celebrate the birth of Jesus and God's intervention in human life; but we are aware that God's reign is not yet fully realized. But it could be...

When Paul wrote to Titus, he believed that Jesus would return any minute. Paul encouraged Titus (and us) to live God-honoring lives today, as if Jesus would appear tomorrow. We do not need to wait for Jesus to come again, to begin living Kingdom-lives. We can live, kingdom *now into*, becoming people Jesus can "be proud of, energetic in goodness" and transforming the world into something amazing.

I am making Titus 2:11-14 the key text for our Christmas Eve services this year. The hopefulness, the expectancy, the light shining in the darkness, and God's intervention into human affairs all seem like something we should explore and celebrate together.

Stewardship Committee

Endowment Committee

The Endowment Team recommended, and D&E approved four Heritage Grants totaling \$10,000 from the Federated Church endowment.

- \$800 BIO Girls (Beautiful Inside & Out) is a group dedicated to building self-worth in girls 2-6th grades through life skills curriculum, mentoring and non-competitive physical activity.
- \$3,200 Federated Church's Board of Managers for the purchase of an updated security system.
- \$3,000 Habitat-4-Humanity to assist with the builds underway on Lenore Drive, Fergus Falls.
- \$3,000 Jail, Inc. to support the ongoing ministry of the chaplains in Otter Tail County.

We are blessed by these local ministries and proud to support them from the proceeds of generous gifts from God and our members.

Mission Committee Christmas Church Offering

Safety At Federated
