Ice Fishing Outing



Did you know that the practice of making New Year's resolutions goes back over 3,000 years to the ancient Babylonians? Each new year gives us the feeling of a fresh start and a new beginning. There really is no difference between December 31 and January 1, nothing mystical occurs at midnight on December 31, but somehow life feels different on January 1.

Common New Year's resolutions are commitments to quit smoking, to stop drinking, to manage money more wisely, and to spend more time with family. By far, the most common New Year's resolution is to lose weight, in conjunction with exercising more and eating more healthily. These are all good goals to set. However, 1 Timothy 4:8 instructs us to keep exercise in perspective: "For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come." Most New Year's resolutions, even among Christians, relate to physical things. All well and good; but we can think bigger!

Many Christians make New Year's resolutions to pray more, to read the Bible every day, and to attend church more regularly. These are fantastic goals. However, these New Year's resolutions fail just as often as the non-spiritual resolutions because there is no power in a New Year's resolution. Resolving to start or stop doing a certain activity has no value unless you have the proper motivation for stopping or starting that activity. For example, why do you want to read the Bible every day? Is it to honor God and grow spiritually, or is it because you have just heard that it is a good thing to do? Why do you want to lose weight? Is it to honor God with your body, or is it for vanity, to honor yourself?

Philippians 4:13 tells us, "I can do everything through Christ who gives me strength." John 15:5 declares, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, then you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." If God is the center of your New Year's resolution, it

has a greater chance for success. If it is God's will for something to be fulfilled, God will enable you to fulfill it. If a resolution is not God-honoring or is not in agreement with God's Word, we will not receive God's help in fulfilling the resolution.

So, what sort of New Year's resolution should a Christian make? Here are some suggestions:

- Pray to the Lord for wisdom regarding what resolutions, if any, God would have you make.
- Pray for wisdom as to how to fulfill the goals God gives you.
- Rely on God's strength to help you.
- Find an accountability partner who will help you and encourage you.
- Allow setbacks to motivate you further.
- Always give the glory to God.
- Find a way to help a neighbor or volunteer in the community.
- Speak only kind, uplifting, and enriching words to one another.
- Forgive someone and let go of the hurt.
- Seek reconciliation.
- Reach out to someone you have not spoken to for some time.
- Allow someone to do something nice for you or help you (it's not a gift until it is received!)

Psalm 47:5-6 says, "Commit your way to the LORD; trust in God and God will do this: God will make your righteousness shine like the dawn, the justice of your cause like the noonday sun." That sounds like a pretty good way to start out the new year!

ANNUAL MEETING OF THE CONGREGATION

Sunday, January 23, 2022 (10:30 AM)

The Deacons & Elders cordially invite you to attend the Annual Meeting of the Federated Church Congregation on Sunday, January 31, 2021, at 10:30 AM, for the purpose of electing officers, reviewing the 2022 budget, approving the pastor's compensation, and conducting other routine business of the congregation.

Meeting Format:

- This will be a hybrid meeting and members may participate in-person at Federated Church or online via Zoom.
- A link to the online meeting will be provided by email one week prior to the meeting.

Meeting Spaces:

- Members attending the annual meeting in-person and masked will gather in the sanctuary, sitting spatially distanced.
- Members wishing to attend the annual meeting online will be sent a link to join via Zoom from their computer, laptop, tablet, or smartphone.

Annual Reports:

- The annual meeting reports and the proposed 2022 budget will be available on the church website (federatedff.org) one week prior to the meeting (January 16, 2022).
- No paper copies will be provided.
- Reports will be shared on the screen during the meeting.

Recording:

- For transparency and voting accuracy, the meeting will be recorded both by video (in-house) and by Zoom.
- The annual meeting will not be broadcast on Boxcast.com or YouTube.

Voting Procedures:

- In-Person voting will be by hand for attendees in the sanctuary.
- Online voting will be by Zoom's voting feature at the bottom of the screen. Please note Zoom can only record one (1) vote per household. For multiple voters, use the chat feature.

Recording Votes:

- Votes will be verified by D&E delegates and recorded by the Clerk.
- The minutes will reflect in-person votes, online votes, and the total number of votes cast.

Safety Procedures: For everyone's protection, members attending in-person are asked to wear a face mask, sanitize hands, and stay spatially distant (3-ft apart).

Offer Grace: We ask for your patience a measure of grace in the likely event that things do not go exactly as planned.

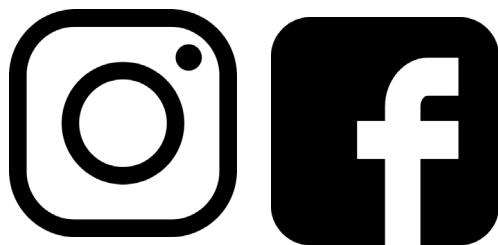
