Pastor's Pen

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was with God in the beginning. Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. In him was life, and that life was the light of all humankind. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it...The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth. John 1:1-5, 14

I've been thinking a lot about LIGHT lately. I don't like it when the days get shorter, and the nights get longer. But I realized something: it is only in the darkness that we clearly see the lights. And there are a lot of lights appearing these days. I love to see the Christmas lights on homes.

All this made me think of John 1, one of my favorite Advent-Christmas texts, especially verse 5: "The *light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.*" John spoke of Jesus – the Word – who was with God from before time began and in whom all things are created. "In him was life, and that life was the light of all humankind" (v. 4). God sent Jesus, the light, to shine on our darkest days, and nothing that happens can ever extinguish that light.

This is truly hopeful news! The world can be a dark and terrifying place. There are many things that happen to us that try to darken our life's light. We know heartache and sickness. Sometimes we feel lonely and afraid. We can be anxious and unsettled. We can be uncertain about the future. But when we remember that Jesus came to be the light of the world, and when we put our trust in him, we fight back against the darkness a little.

Light is often used as a symbol for hope. We put lights on our homes and Christmas trees and in our windows to remind ourselves that spring will come after the winter, to affirm that hope abounds, and proclaim that the darkness is temporary.

I challenge you to be bright, shining lights to and for one another. Be bright, shining lights to your family, friends, and neighbors in this cold, dark world. Use your light to help others to see their way forward in life and in faith. Be warmth for those who are cold, lonely, sick, or oppressed. Share your energy with those who need it.

May the light of your love never go out or grow dim. May you burn brightly together, encouraged by Jesus, the light of the world.

Blessings for your Advent! Merry Christmas! Happy New Year!

Caramel Rolls

2 loaves frozen bread dough 1 stick margarine 1 c. brown sugar 1 (5-oz.) pkg vanilla pudding 1 T. cinnamon 1/2 tsp. cinnamon

Thaw dough and do not let it rise. In a 9X13-inch pan, grease with margarine, and spray. Tear one loaf into pieces and toss in the pan. In a medium pan, melt margarine. Add brown sugar, pudding, and cinnamon. Stir on low heat until mixed and smooth. Pour the caramel sauce over the bread dough. Tear the second loaf of bread and toss on top. Let sit and rise for 1/2 hour. Bake at 350 degrees for 30 to 40 minutes. Flip on foil lined-pan.
