# Sunday Morning Bible Study

#### **Measuring What Matters**

We are stewards of everything. Stewardship is what God wants us to do with everything God gives us: the overflowing abundance of time, talent, opportunities, relationships, location, and resources. We are bombarded with invitations to measure ourselves against a variety of other standards set by the world. We receive thousands of messages daily which tell us we are not good enough, smart enough, rich enough, pretty enough, or capable enough to succeed in life. "Measuring What Matters" is about evaluating our life, our faith, and the use of our resources according to the values of God's Realm. This study explores our allegiances, our faith, our compassion, our use of money, our generosity, and our belief that God provides what is ultimately necessary for living a faithful life. This is stewardship as discipleship, partnering with God through the mission and ministries of the local church to change the world.

#### Misbehavin' Monarchs: Exploring Biblical **Kings of Questionable Character**

Based on the book by Barbara J. Essex © 2006 The history of Israel's kings is checkered at best. Some were good kings, faithful to God and God's ways, and Israel prospered. Others were terrible kings, preferring to go their own way with disastrous results for God's people. Of the over 40 men and one woman who served as monarchs, we will study eight: Saul, David, Solomon, Rehoboam, Jeroboam, Athaliah, Hoshea, and Zedekiah. We will consider their faithfulness to God, their shortcomings and failures, the women, prophets, and politicians who influenced their decisions, the historical context of the era, and the outcome of their reigns. There are good (and bad) leadership lessons to be learned from their stories.







### Faith Among the Faithless: Learning from Esther How to Live in a World Gone Mad

Based on the book by Mike Cosper

Can Christianity survive a secular age? Can Christians live without compromise in an increasingly hostile society? What if a Christian gives in to society's vision and values?

Mike Cosper answers these questions by pointing out the parallels between our world and the story of Esther. A tale of sex, ego, and revenge, the book of Esther reveals a world where God seems absent from everyday life: a world not unlike our own. The story of Esther is a brutal saga of people assimilated into a pluralistic, pagan society, embracing its standards. Yet when threatened with annihilation, they find the courage to turn to God in humility. This is a call to spiritual awakening and to faith in an age of malaise and apathy. This is an invitation to remember the faithfulness of God who, even in dark times, may be hidden but is never absent.

#### Choir


The choir will start practice on Wednesday, August 30 at 7pm. The choir will sing on Rally Day during worship.

# Vacation Bible School 2023





Bugs biting and mosquitoes buzzing, grills cooking, sprinklers running, fruit ripening, ice cream melting, and baseball bats cracking. We feel summer in our bodies, feel summer on our skin, taste and smell summer, see and hear summer. These months teem with life. Considering that God, the Creator, invented summer, there's theological truth here, and a spiritual invitation.

What can summer help us learn, or grasp, or experience with our bodies about God and truth that are easier to forget in cooler, quieter days? What spiritual value lies in the early morning sunshine, or in the onslaught of weeds in my garden?

God is the Creator and our story began in a garden. God saved and redeemed this world not primarily through ideas or doctrine, but by taking on a body in Jesus and walking and talking with us and using tangible things like bread and wine and water and fish to teach us about God's relationship with us.

Summer is a time that we can learn about the kingdom of heaven through things we can taste and smell, see and touch. Here are ideas for this last month of summer to do just that!

- Breathe. Take in a deep breath and remember that God's breath sustains us. Exhale and surrender into God's presence. Whether your summer is more vacation or chaos, prayerful breathing reminds us that our life is in God.
- Step Outside. Find time to step outside.
   This is the world God made, the world God joined us in. How do you see God's hand-iwork here? What does this tell you about God?
- See and Hear. Spend some time doing nothing but seeing and hearing. Soak in what God made and what God is doing here and now.
- Taste and Smell. Stop and smell some flowers today. At mealtimes, don't just eat and drink: Taste. Smell. Savor. There's no time like summer to practice enjoying what's in front of us each day.

God's work in our world is earthy and teeming with life. And today, at least for today, you and I are too.
