

Jesus saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. Titus 3:5

Timothy Keller, the founding pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church in New York City, once wrote, "The gospel is this: We are more sinful and flawed in ourselves than we ever dared believe, yet at the very same time we are more loved and accepted in Jesus Christ than we ever dared hope."

He is right, of course. We like to believe that we are basically good people. We tend to downplay our faults and hide our shortcomings from others. We always try to put our "best foot forward" and present a good face to the world. But, in truth, we are deeply flawed creatures who, left to our own devises, will turn inward, and become selfish.

Based on our own merit, none of us deserves any mercy from God. Yet God, in God's infinite capacity to love and forgive, extends us God's grace. Because we could not correct our human nature without help, God sent Jesus to teach us a better way to live, to die on the cross to forgive our sins (as only God can do), and then offer us new and eternal life with him.

While it may not take too much convincing for us to accept that we are "more sinful and flawed... than we ever dared believe," many of us struggle

mightily with the fact that we are "more loved and accepted in Jesus Christ than we ever dared hope." It's a little sad, really, that we can more readily admit our imperfect nature than we can acknowledge God's love for us. We claim we are not worthy of such love. We say we do not deserve such forgiveness. And we aren't. We can never be good enough to demand God's love and acceptance. But the good news of the gospel is that we don't have to be good enough. Titus writes: "Jesus saved us, not because of righteous things we had done, but because of his mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit."

Jesus, of his own free will, decided to lay down his life for ours. Jesus, with his deep love for humanity, chose to do what we could not do: make us right with God. By his death and resurrection, we are reborn, not to the life we had before, but to a new and better life. We may now, with the Holy Spirit's help, live free from sin. We have the chance to be the people God meant for us to be. Whatever happened before, is over. Whatever happens now, is up to us.

November is a good time to give thanks for God's many blessings to us. The greatest blessing is that Jesus thought us worth saving. Thanks be to God for God's love and acceptance in Jesus Christ.

I am a runner. For most of my adult life, I have found the rhythm of my feet on the asphalt step after step an important habit. It is the time when I have nothing to focus on except putting one foot in front of the other and on my breathing—both things that sometimes come easy, without much thought and other times are a more labored taking a bit more mental strength to complete. It was during those miles that I have the most honest and focused conversations with God.

Now, I am not talking about running because I think everybody should be a runner to connect with God. I completely respect those who think that running is only for gym class and when you are being chased by a bear. I used to be that person. Running is something which I came to accidentally and I see it as one of the mysterious graces of my life. I am talking about running because I think running has provided lessons for the journey of faith.

I recently read a blog on the habits needed to become a lifelong runner. I expected to read things about nutrition and stretching and ways to increase your endurance. Instead, I read that the number one thing needed to be a lifelong runner, is to be a lifelong learner. If I am going to run until my body won't let me anymore then I need to never think that I know everything

there is to know about running. I need to keep learning--from others in the running community, the evolving science about our bodies, from my body, from my injuries and the pain I endure.

As I read that blog, I couldn't help but think that faith is a journey of never being done learning. We come to God like a child, a beginner's mind, never thinking that we know everything there is to know. We keep learning-from the people around us, from the new things discovered about language and the Bible and God's ongoing conversation with the world. We learn to navigate injury and doubt, how to get broken and bruised and to come through it not the same but changed. We learn how not to be alone and to lean on others for support and encouragement and prayer—learning that we don't and won't have everything figured out in this life. We live and learn in the mysterious grace of God.

Just as I continue to learn to keep my feet hitting the asphalt year and after year, I am called as a Christian to keep learning. And so are you. We can hope. We can believe. But we should always remain unfinished, ready to be challenged, open to hearing, seeing, experiencing and learning something new.

#### **Adult Bible Study**

Faith Among the Faithless: Learning from Esther How to Live in a World Gone Mad Based on the book by Mike Cosper

Can Christianity survive a secular age? Can Christians live without compromise in an increasingly hostile society? What if a Christian gives in to society's vision and values?

Mike Cosper answers these questions by pointing out the parallels between our world and the story of Esther. A tale of sex, ego, and revenge, the book of Esther reveals a world where God seems absent from everyday life: a world not unlike our own. The story of Esther is a brutal saga of people assimilated into a pluralistic, pagan society, embracing its standards. Yet when threatened with annihilation, they find the courage to turn to God in humility. This is a call to spiritual awakening and to faith in an age of malaise and apathy. This is an invitation to remember the faithfulness of God who, even in dark times, may be hidden but is never absent.

# Christian Education and Youth Rev. Karen Anderson

As I write this it is a beautiful October day with blue skies, amazing autumn colors, and an easy warmth in the air. It is hard to believe that winter is just around the corner! Hopefully it will hold off for a bit and give us all a little more time to enjoy the season. With November beginning we have some things to look forward to in our Christian Education programming.

#### **Sunday School**

We will be holding our monthly Pre-K and Parent class, beginning on Sunday, November 5th after worship in the youth room. The group will be led by Cindy Spidahl and Jill Iverson. This will be a time for fellowship for children and parents. Please feel free to join the class if you are a parent or grandparent of a child or children ages 0-5.

Our K-6th classes are finishing up studying the Fruit of the Spirit, and as we get to the end of the month, we will begin working on our Christmas pageant, which is set for December 17th during the worship service. We join forces with our Kidz Club crew to share the story of Jesus's birth and sing some favorite Christmas carols.

#### Kidz Club

Our Kidz Club crew is continuing our focus on Jesus, hearing several of His parables during October and November. We will, along with Sunday school youth, begin working on the Christmas pageant as we near the end of November. Our group LOVES to make creative crafts and spend time in the gym. The group has grown a bit this year, making it a fun time for everyone!

#### Confirmation

Our confirmation class continues to study questions of faith with Pastor Doug. Every four or five weeks we have a "youth group" gathering instead of regular class, led by Pastor Karen. It is a fun break for everyone and an opportunity to do faith talk and games. Our 7-9th

grade students are working on their sermon notes and can also take opportunities to help in worship as part of their confirmation time.

#### Senior High Youth Group

Senior high youth group continues to meet each week for a time of fellowship, learning, prayer, and games. We have a diverse gathering of individuals from all walks of high school life—it is tremendously enjoyable to spend quality time with these wonderful people! Our recent topics include analyzing a Simpson's episode (there is a lot of faith material in the show!). Current events in the Middle East and how they relate to the Bible. Does God punish His people? What if today was your last day, and the supernatural war going on around us. We try to go into deep topics in order to get our young people thinking about the intersection of their faith with the world around them. As you might imagine, we have an enlightening and invigorating conversation.

#### Women's Bible Study

Our group continues to work through Paul's letter to the Philippians—which he wrote while in prison. We are continually amazed by his focus on living with joy amid difficult circumstances, knowing that he truly lived what he wrote. It is a necessary reminder for all of us that we are to find our joy in the unchanging Lord! Feel free to join us at 11:15am on Tuesdays in the parlor.

Pastor Karen Anderson is planning to begin a Bible study on the book of Revelation during the month of January. It will likely be on Mondays in the early evening—6:30-8 pm.
