The popularity of the ballet The Nutcracker skyrockets during Advent and the Christmas season because of its pageantry, dancing, and timeless classical music. But have you ever wondered what the story is really about? If so, you're not alone.

The story is much clearer, says the Reverend Matt Rawle, the lead pastor at Asbury United Methodist Church in Bossier City, Louisiana, if we use a "lens of faith" to look more closely at the characters and the action. The story actually resonates with strong parallels to our faith and helps us prepare for Christmas.

We can see many parallels to our faith in what happens to the characters. Clara, the main character, is at that "in between" age, always waiting to grow older, waiting for someone, waiting to understand the world. She is loved dearly by her peculiar godfather who gives her a special gift: the Nutcracker. After the Nutcracker comes to life, he battles the evil Mouse King, only to die in battle. However, the loving godfather resurrects the Nutcracker, who then takes Clara to his kingdom to the acclaim of many who have awaited his return. Sound familiar?

Like Clara, we Christians understand what it's like to live in an "in between" time of life. We live in this world, raise families, enjoy traditions, and celebrate holidays and holy days. Yet Paul encourages us to not be conformed to this world, but to be transformed by the renewing of your minds." (Romans 12:2). Like Clara, we find that it is often in these periods of waiting that we see the most growth in our lives.

Or consider Herr Drosselmeir, Clara's peculiar godfather, who gives her the Nutcracker. He also produces a puppet show that foreshadows future events, though it doesn't disclose everything that will happen. If we are watching the play for the first time, we may not know this. But, if once we have seen the play in its entirety, we know what events lie ahead.

Similarly, the Scripture passages during Advent foretell the coming of the Messiah, God's gift of God's only begotten son. We know now that Jesus is the King of Kings, but people in the first century did not know the full story. "Scripture doesn't tell us everything we want to know," writes Rawle, "but it does reveal everything that we need."

The Mouse King is the villain of the story. We're not quite sure who he is or why he wants to battle the Nutcracker, but Clara fears him from the start. Are there times when fear and suspicion are the dominant feelings in our day? Are we constantly fighting battles, both real and perceived ones, throughout the day? Clara finds comfort when the Nutcracker is by her side, but what about us? Do we truly feel peace and the hope for a new life by realizing that God will never abandon us?

The Nutcracker himself is "the greatest gift." When Clara receives the Nutcracker at the Christmas party, she doesn't know what to think about the gift. It wasn't something that she wanted, but she found out later that it was a gift that she needed.

In one sense, Jesus is the gift we wanted, but we are surprised to find that he is also the gift we need. Jesus calls us all to turn the other cheek, welcome our neighbor, feed and clothe the poor, even carry his cross. If we are to welcome the Christ child into our lives at Christmas, we must also embody his teachings and act more like Jesus during the rest of the year.

Much like our journey as Christians, Clara's story is one that begins with uncertainty, fear, and struggle, yet ends with comfort, hope, and joy. Both The Nutcracker and the Advent story unfold just as we know they will, but not without the hope and anticipation that always accompany both the dance and the season.

Holidays, including any special day, can be an especially difficult time for people who have experienced the death of someone dear to them even if the loss isn't recent. It's often a time when the experience and feelings of loss are heightened. The holiday season feels different, especially if it is the first one without your loved one. It is important that we recognize these feelings of grief, loss, and sadness rather than avoid them. I have put together a list of ways to acknowledge this part of the season as well to honor your loved ones who are not here to celebrate this year.

- Make a plan: Create a plan about what you'll do to mark the holiday and who you'll be with. Let
 go of the "shoulds" and focus on what you need. Make a plan that is respectful of your feelings
 and energy, and it can include things you have always done or something different.
- Realizing grief is unique: We all experience grief in our own way and so each family member may
 have different needs. Communicate with each other about your needs and discuss what each
 person is most worried about or what they are dreading about the celebration. The actual day
 may or may not be as bad as imagined. For some the anticipation of the day is harder and for
 others the aftermath is harder.
- Stay flexible: Keep your plan as flexible and as simple as possible. There may be times when you
 need to skip certain activities depending on how you or family members are feeling. Don't feel
 pressure to over-commit yourself and accept every invitation that comes your way. Give yourself
 permission to make your final decisions the day of the event.
- Make time for feelings and self-care: It's important to acknowledge that you'll need time and space for the feelings that are likely to arise. Be sure to include self-care in your plan—take a nap, warm bath, or walk, eat nutritious food or use a journal to express your thoughts and feelings.
- Find ways to remember your loved one: Finding ways to remember your loved one during the
 holidays gives everyone permission to acknowledge the loss and provides a way to continue the
 relationship with the loved one. Some ideas for you to consider: Lighting a candle, setting a place
 at the table, sharing stories during a gathering, make a donation in their memory, create a memory book or box, keep a tradition that they enjoyed.
- Do something different: Break tradition or create a new tradition. Change what you eat for Christmas dinner or decorate in a different way. Acknowledge that not everything is the same as it has always been.
- **Be honest with God:** Don't put your prayer life on the back burner: God wants a real relationship with you, even if that means being angry or sobbing when you try to pray. Shed your expectations of what you "should" and "shouldn't" do for prayer, and just show up to let God love you.
- **Prepare for the holiday letdown:** Realize there is a new normal about what the holidays will mean for you from this point onward.
- **Grief support:** You will survive this time, even if it is painful. Joining a group or talking with a counselor can give you important support during this difficult time. One of the most important things you can do for yourself when you're grieving is to get support, whether from friends, family and/or outside support.

(Please refrain from making checks out to the church to expedite processing.) Other ways to help include sharing Xyola's page with people you know, talking it up, repeat giving, and prayers are always welcome.
