"Jesus said, 'It is finished.' Then he bowed his head and gave up his spirit" (John 19:30). If this is where our story stopped, we would not be living as people of the resurrection. We would be stunted at the crossroads, having no clue where to go and what to do. We would not know who we are or where we were going. But thanks be to God, that is not where our story ends; that is just the beginning. God does something miraculous through Jesus Christ, so we can shout with joy-filled hearts on Easter Sunday, "CHRIST IS RISEN!"

"He is not here; for he has been raised" (Matthew 28:6). This is what we proclaim on Easter Sunday and every day following. God's greatest promise is that Jesus is not dead, he lives! Remember the true meaning of Easter, which is the Resurrection. As the world brings out fluffy bunnies, sweet treats, and colored eggs, be rooted in the promises of forgiveness and grace that comes from a crucified and risen Savior.

Remember that when you come to worship, we worship together, with trumpets and song to the God of unparalleled love. We worship a God who gave everything so we might know the comfort and promise of God's grace.

Mission Committee

Food Share Month

March is Food Share Month, the month when our donations to the Fergus Falls Food Shelf have an even greater impact than usual due to special support from Minnesota FoodShare and the Feinstein Foundation. In keeping with our tradition, the Federated Church Mission Committee will match food shelf donations from the congregation – up to \$700 – during March.

The food shelf is a valuable resource for local families, but support is especially needed this year as its grocery costs have increased from about \$12,000 a month to \$20,000. All donations are appreciated!

In 2023, the food shelf served a total of 332 households with 783 members. Of those, 61 percent were adults, 14 percent were seniors and 25 percent were children under the age of 18.

The food shelf is open Wednesdays and Fridays and last year averaged 40 clients each business day.

It's easy to contribute during Food Share Month: You can put your donation in one of the special envelopes you'll find in the pews during March; donate online through Tithe.ly; or mail a check to the church with Food Shelf in the memo line.

Did you know that the word Lent means spring? As we go through this season preparing for Easter and the resurrection, we can see signs of the whole earth getting ready to blossom and grow. These themes of life and growth aren't just for the cycles of the liturgy. They also resonate with our life as Christians. As God's people we can also expect to go through cycles of quiet and rest as well as life and growth. Lent can be a time of spring for discipleship. We can reflect on our own growth as children of God.

As I reflect on this season of life and growth and change in terms of pastoral care, I am captivated by the idea that a Christian is like a tree. Scripture often uses the image of people growing in the light of God. We Christians, like trees, are called to have deep roots. Just as secret waterways nourish tree roots, we are sustained by the waters of our baptism. Our rootedness comes from years of worship, prayer, and Bible Study. We find our roots in the communities that have nourished our faith in various times in our lives. In times of spiritual drought, we count on the foundations of our family practices and church traditions to give us stability. We rely on our faith communities to help us find life when it is hard to find it for ourselves. Deep roots make us strong.

We Christians, like trees, are called to have strong but flexible trunks, so that when the storms of life come, when changes blow through, we must be able to bend and sway or we will break. Like the tree, we must learn how to stand strong and where we can bend. Rings of wisdom helps us both to maintain structure and adapt to the changing world around us.

And like trees, our branches reach out into the world around us providing shelter and life. It is not to exist as we always have, we must reach out. We stretch our branches to grow new fruit, to provide shade for those in need and to provide shelter in surprising ways...working to serve people who are hungry or homeless, sick or lonely helps us grow as Christians and fulfill our calling as God's people. In this season of Lent (and spring), may we, like the trees, grow deep roots, strong (but flexible) trunks, and wide branches. And may we remember the one who on the tree of the cross brought life and salvation for us all.

Local Mission

Thank you for your continued generosity with the Local Mission Fund! Those who are helped by this fund are extremely grateful for the extra support they receive during tough times. According to our policy, we are able to help each family or individual three times during a 12 month period, with up to \$100 a time, depending on funds. We assist with food, utilities, rent, and, in emergency situations, a night at a hotel. Donations can be put in the offering plate with Local Mission Fund in the memo line or dropped off in the church office. Thank you!
