Pastor's Pen

In my circle of Reformed folk, we like to talk about our "world and life view," or a way of looking at life through the lens of faith – a faith that believes the Holy Spirit is at work in this world, claiming it for Christ and establishing God's reign on earth.

As Abraham Kuyper famously said, "There is not a square inch in the whole domain of our human existence over which Christ, who is Sovereign over all, does not cry, 'Mine!''' ¹

Our is a faith that sings, "Every inch of this universe belongs to you, O Christ. For though you and for you it was made. Your creation endures by the order of your hand. So you must have in all things the first place."²

Yet so often our professed faith and our lived faith don't align. Instead of seeing our daily life as an expression of our faith and as part of the larger mission of building God's realm on earth, we relegate our faith to an hour of corporate worship, a small group or Bible study, and maybe a few moments of daily prayer or personal devotions. But that's not the way it's supposed to be, nor does it need to be.

We need to understand that all of life is under the lordship of Jesus and should be lived for his glory. Our worship is intended to sing God's praises, to hear God's word, and to reinforce the idea that our whole lives are an extension of our faith. As Ron Man says, "Worship as a church and worship as a lifestyle are in a mutually enriching relationship." ³

There is a rhythm to our work and worship. Our daily work should be an extension of our corporate worship. What we say and do outside of worship should be influenced by what we say and do at worship. The ebb and flow of work and worship informs our whole life.

As we begin the season of Lent with Ash Wednesday (March 5), I invite you to worship with us on Sundays and Wednesdays, and then during the special days of Holy Week with services on Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Let your praise resound! Let God's Word be proclaimed! Let your life be a partner to your worship!

At our Wednesday Lenten services, we will focus on Jesus' time in the wilderness, his temptations by the devil, and his preparation for his public ministry. May his experiences inform our own as we worship and work in God's world and to God's glory.

Mission Committee

FoodShare Month

March is Food Share Month, the month when our donations to the Fergus Falls Food Shelf have an even greater impact than usual due to special support from Minnesota FoodShare and the Feinstein Foundation. In keeping with our tradition, the Federated Church Mission Committee has committed to match the first \$900 in donations from the congregation during March.

The food shelf is a valuable resource for local families, but support is especially critical this year as its grocery costs have soared from a previous average of \$12,000 to \$15,000 a month to nearly \$20,000, and the number of clients in need is increasing. All donations are appreciated!

In all of 2024, the food shelf served nearly 4,000 families and distributed 500,000 pounds of food. Volunteers, including many members of Federated Church, gave 4,000 hours of their time and talent.

In January 2025 alone, the food shelf served 321 households with 711 household members, including 95 seniors and 158 children. Thirtyone families came to the food shelf for the first time as families struggle with increasing costs for necessities including groceries, insurance and gasoline.

It's easy to contribute during Food Share Month: You can put your donation in one of the special envelopes you'll find in the pews during March; donate online through Tithe.ly; or mail a check to the church with Food Shelf in the memo line.

Thanks to all who support this valuable mission! For those in need, the Fergus Falls Community Food Shelf distributes on Wednesdays and Fridays.
