Sunday, November 30 Choir Sings Advent Begins



Our family has a Thanksgiving tradition: we go around the table, and each person says one thing for which they are thankful. Like you, our family is thankful for family, for jobs, and for health; we are thankful for another year together; we are thankful for having enough; we are thankful for a country with freedoms, and we are thankful for a church that feels like family.

I like this tradition. There is something powerful about group gratitude. Not only do we learn a little bit more about the people we are related to, but it also has the power to shift the dynamic of the room. Everyone stops. Everyone listens. Everyone shares in the thankfulness of the other.

The Apostle Paul wrote: "Thanks be to God for God's indescribable gift!" (2 Corinthians 9:15). We have a lot to be thankful for each year, and it is good and right for us to thank God for spouses, kids, jobs, and health. But when Paul says, "We thank God for God's indescribable gift!" he is talking about something specific, someone specific. Paul is not thanking God for things (though he could, and in other places in the New Testament, he did); rather, he is thanking God for Jesus. Or to say it another way, Paul is thanking God for God.

The greatest gift God ever gave the world was Jesus Christ, who was and is God in the flesh.

This is really what Christmas is about: the idea that God became a human ("the incarnation"). As C.S. Lewis put it in *Mere Christianity*, "The Son of God became a man to enable men to become sons of God." And although Paul knew nothing of our American holiday on the fourth Thursday of November, I think it is right for us to talk about Christmas at Thanksgiving. Not because I'm trying to rush past this holiday and get on to the next one; but because our gratitude on this holiday is informed by the next one.

This Thanksgiving, I encourage you to thank God for all the people and things in your life. Be specific in your gratitude; articulate and enumerate all the blessings God has given you, because "Every good and perfect gift is from above" (James 1:17). I also encourage you to thank God for God; thank God for who God is. The purpose of all earthly blessings is not that we become infatuated with the gift as an end to itself, but rather, to draw our eyes to the Giver. God was the one who gave a Son so that you and I could be rescued from sin and restored to relationship with God. God did all of this to reach us.

We have so much for which to be thankful. Happy Thanksgiving! Pastor Doug

Our Senior Spotlight this month is on our 3rd oldest member of Federated...Loran Johnson

When I visited Loran recently, his daughter, Lori Beske, happened to stop by. She was helpful in prompting some of his attributes and memories. Loren, who is now age 94, was born to Clara and George Johnson June 7, 1931. He was the youngest of three boys and grew up on his grandparents farm near Orwell Dam. Clara, his mother, was German, while George, his father, was Swedish. Loren spent much of his time doing all of the farm chores with his brothers Harlan and Elton. "I milked lots of cows," Loran expressed, but in their spare time, they played baseball and yard games.

As many kids did in those days, he attended Country School for 8 years, which was a mile to walk from his home. Then he attended 4 years of high school in Fergus Falls. Being there were no school busses in those days, he stayed in town with an aunt and uncle. After high school, he attended the Wahpeton State School of Science for two years to receive an electrical trade degree. From there, Loran joined the Army and served our country in Korea.

A neighbor girl he had known since country school was Geraldine Stock. He fondly remembers giving her rides to high school in his Model A car. They wrote letters to each other during his time in the Army. "I wrote to her every day." Loran remembers. After he returned home, they got married in September of 1954. They began their marriage in the house on West Linden, where Loran still lives today (with help from his adult children). There Loran and Gerry raised their four children: Lori, Lindsay, Lisa and Kurt. Loran worked in the meter department at Otter Tail Power for 39 years.

Geraldine was a good cook. Both Lori and Loran raved about her rosettes that she made at Christmas.

They also described to me what the Knipp (German) main dish was like: chopped up pork sausage mixed with oatmeal (like a gravy) on homemade bread. After the kids were grown, Gerry worked at Mid-American Dairyman for about 20 years. She went to her heavenly home 14 years ago.

Loran played Adult City Softball until he was 40 years old. It helped to have all of that practice earlier with his dad and brothers. Lori bragged that her «dad can fix anything» and is a «Do it Yourself kind of guy".

He has always had a beautiful lawn, and has a 7 year old pear tree in his front lawn that produces many, many pears each year. Loran gives them to friends and neighbors, and also to the Salvation Army and the Food Shelf.

In his later years, Loran took on the craft of wood carving. He makes very detailed pieces, such as his golfing figurines which represent his years of golfing, which Lori showed me.

Loran is most proud of his "Four good kids!" Family and fun are important to him. What a pleasure it is to visit with him.

KIDZ CLUB

This fall we are studying the covenants, or promises, that God gave/gives His people in the Old Testament. We spend each week learning one of the unique promises God made through the people He called for His purposes: Adam and Eve, Noah, Abraham, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, David, Daniel, and ultimately—Jesus our Messiah. We are working our way to Jesus, seeing how God prepared the world and people's hearts for His plan of salvation through Jesus. Our Christmas pageant will be an opportunity for the congregation to see what we have learned and how God moved through His people to bring us Jesus.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

Sunday school meets each week after worship and goes to about 11:15am. We have wonderful teachers for our different classes, and we all look forward to seeing our kids. Come join our classes each week

and get to know: K-1 teachers are Jona Brown and Madalyn Dent, 2-6th grade students have Sam and Kai Ebert and "older youth" teacher is Hollis Davenport. The topic for the 2-6th grade this year is how science and faith intersect—what does the Bible say about science. Our younger crew covers several great topics, and Hollis is always prepared with a thought-provoking subject. During the later part of November, we will use Sunday school time to work on our Christmas pageant.

CONFIRMATION

Our after-school 7th and 8th grade class continue to meet each week on Wednesdays, with snacks, games, and confirmation lessons. Once a month or so we take a break and hold a "regular" youth group gathering, where we tackle issues of faith and simply spend time having meaningful fellowship with one another. We have some incredibly inquisitive young people who enjoy digging into important issues and wrestling with tough topics.

We have such a great group of young people coming to our youth group. It is a strong mixture of those who grew up in the church and friends who were invited and continue to return each week. We are blessed to have such a faithful group even though they are BUSY PEOPLE! Most of them work, many of them are in sports, and a lot of them have other after-school activities. It is a special time for all of us to step out of "the world" and see how God is working in our lives and the lives of those around us.
